Joe Hyer was a consultant, not a campaign manager.

Non Union printing is not a violation.

Percival Consulting did not provide any “in kind” services. We were charged for the cost of services including the materials and printing.

When remit envelopes are ordered from a printer and delivered, invoices are not broken down by labor, materials and printing? It’s just considered printing, correct?

Invoice #683 from Percival Consulting did not indicate any postage in the description. The other printed items fall under “political advertising” in the PDC’s guidelines below so, the entire invoice was categorized as broadcast advertising. However, if the PDC wants us to correct the record, how would you like us to categorize them? Are they printing?

Definitions

Political advertising includes any advertising displays, newspaper ads, billboards, signs, brochures, articles, tabloids, flyers, letters, radio or television presentations, digital or social media advertising, or other means of mass communication, used for the purpose of appealing, directly or indirectly, for votes or for financial or other support in any election campaign. [RCW 42.17A.005\(36\)](#)

We are happy to comply with the PDC and correct any errors for the record.
