VerifyMore, a 501(c)3 "nonprofit" runs a service where they provide newspapers and campaigns with background checks and other "vetting" services for candidates. While they offer these services for "\$150 to \$300 per candidate," the organization is not registered as an incidental committee and has not filed any reports. The "reports" and "case studies" from this "nonprofit" amount to paid electioneering communications and attack ads.

The DISCLOSE act (SSB 5991), which took effect Jan 1, 2019, requires nonprofits which engage in electoral activities to register as "incidental committees."
