SEISMIC UPGRADES

By 2020, the population of our Eastside community is estimated to grow another 9%. That means our public hospital must grow accordingly. That's why our new 2019 bond measure will increase our clinical capacity and space to accommodate the area's population growth. **Our bond measure will also address aging infrastructure to ensure that, even in the event of a large earthquake, we will be able to continue delivering the safest care and services possible.**

Proposition No. 1

Bonds for Hospital and Other Health Care Facilities

The Board of Commissioners of King County Public Hospital District No. 2 adopted Resolution No. 895-19 concerning a proposition to finance improvements to its health care facilities. The improvements include Seismic and Infrastructure upgrades; a new Critical Care Unit; updating the Family Maternity Center; new Medical Office Buildings for Specialty Care Expansion; Technology Systems Improvements; and other improvements. Approval of the ballot proposition would authorize issuance of up to \$345,000,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within thirty years to pay for such improvements and the levy of annual excess property taxes to pay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 895-19.
