Hi Micaiah,

I'm very confused about this. I hope this reply will address the concerns.

This is my first campaign. Initially, I never realized I needed to file with the PDC. I was told by a former county commissioner that I didn't need to file **any report** because I wasn't going to spend more than \$5000 of my own money. Again, I am new to this and perhaps I misunderstood, or perhaps I didn't do enough independent research on my own - but I didn't know until weeks after I filed as a candidate that I would need to file these campaign accounting forms.

I filed the C-1 for the mini-campaign on June 14, 2019. I was under the impression that the F-1 was for larger financial campaigns. I then had the complaint filed by Dori Gilmour, so I filed what I thought was the F-1, even though later I was again informed that I didn't need to do that. As far as I am aware, I shouldn't have been required to file an F-1, so the fact it was late should be a moot point.

I was eventually called and informed by someone named Colin that I had filed the C-1, which was sufficient for the size of my campaign, but that I had filed the 2018 form, and I needed to file the 2019 form. Colin wasn't sure how the system allowed me to file last year's form, but nevertheless, I went back into the site and filed the 2019 mini-campaign C-1 form.

I acknowledge that I was late - but as I said, I didn't realize there was either an obligation or timeline until well after I filed my candidacy. When I was informed I needed to file the C-1, I filed it right away. As far as I know at this time, I have filed all the necessary forms.

If there is still something missing, I would appreciate the opportunity to discuss this with someone. Again, this is my first time and I'm certain I am going to make a few mistakes in this process. I thought I had done everything I was required. If there is still a problem, I would appreciate someone explaining why the F-1 is at issue if the C-1 was sufficient? If the F-1 wasn't necessary in the first place, this latest complaint should be dismissed as well.

It might be helpful to have a new-candidate booklet that tells a person exactly what they need to do and when they need to do it by. Just a suggestion!

I hope to hear from someone. I am trying to make sure the right forms are filed, and I acknowledge that I was apparently late - although I have not read nor been directly informed of the time requirements for filing these forms. What is the penalty for being late? Where is that information available for candidates?

I look forward to hearing back.
