Dear Glen Morgan:

The Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) has completed its review of the complaint you filed July 17, 2019.

Your complaint alleged that Debra Entenman, a Candidate for State Representative from the 47<sup>th</sup> Legislative District in 2018 may have violated RCW 42.17A.220(4) for accepting over limit anonymous contributions.

PDC staff reviewed the allegations; the applicable statutes, rules, and reporting requirements; the response provided by Josie Olsen, of Blue Wave Political Partners, LLC and Treasurer for Elect Debra Entenman (Committee); the applicable PDC reports filed by the Committee; data in the PDC contribution and expenditure database to determine whether the record supports a finding of one or more violations. Based on staff’s review, we found the following:

- Debra Entenman was elected to the State Legislature in November 2018, representing the 47<sup>th</sup> Legislative District.
- RCW 42.17A.220(4) states in part that “accumulated unidentified contributions . . . , in excess of one percent of the total accumulated contributions received in the current calendar year, or three hundred dollars, whichever is more, may not be deposited, used, or expended, but shall be returned to the donor if his or her identity can be ascertained. If the donor cannot be ascertained, the contribution shall escheat to the state and shall be paid to the state treasurer for deposit in the state general fund.”
- On its website, PDC guidance outlines the amount of anonymous contributions a committee may accept in a calendar year.
- The complaint alleged that in calendar year 2018, the Committee accepted anonymous contributions in the amount of \$600, which was \$300 more than the allowable limit of \$300.

- Staff’s review of the Monetary Contribution reports (C-3 reports) and Summary Full Campaign Contribution and Expenditure reports (C-4 reports) filed by the Committee found the Committee could accept the greater amount of up to 1 percent of the total accumulated contributions.
- In the response, Olsen noted “the RCW 42.17A.220(4) that Mr. Morgan cites clearly states: Unidentified contributions... in excess of one percent of the total accumulated contributions received in the current calendar year, or three hundred dollars, whichever is more, may not be deposited, used, or expended, but shall be returned to the donor if his or her identity can be ascertained.”
- Olsen then stated “The Committee raised \$335,855.29 in 2018. In this instance, one percent of the total raised in the calendar year was greater than the \$300 limit, and therefore the Committee adhered to the one percent limit of \$3,358.55. The \$600 total in anonymous funds accepted by the committee in 2018 is well below the limit allowed by state law.”

Based on these findings staff has determined in this instance the alleged acceptance of anonymous contributions in excess of the allowable limit without forfeiting the excess amount to the State of Washington does not appear to be a violation warranting further investigation.

The PDC finds that no further action is warranted and has dismissed this matter in accordance with RCW 42.17A.755(1).
