Dear Public Disclosure Commission –

Thank you for the opportunity to respond to the complaint filed on July 26th by Glen Morgan (case #55267). Below is the quick response to his claim:

According to [RCW 42.17A.220 \(4\)](#) and the PDC's online [Candidate Instruction manual](#):

*(4) Accumulated unidentified contributions, other than those made by persons whose names must be maintained on a separate and private list by a political committee's treasurer pursuant to RCW 42.17A.240(2), in excess of one percent of the total accumulated contributions received in the current calendar year, or three hundred dollars, whichever is more, may not be deposited, used, or expended, but shall be returned to the donor if his or her identity can be ascertained. If the donor cannot be ascertained, the contribution shall escheat to the state and shall be paid to the state treasurer for deposit in the state general fund.*

Additionally, the candidate instruction manual says this:

*Occasionally, campaigns receive funds from truly anonymous sources; that is, no one involved in the campaign knows who donated the money. Up to a point, the law allows campaigns to keep these anonymous contributions. Specifically, candidates may receive as much as \$300 or one percent of the total contributions received in a calendar year, whichever is greater.*

In the CY 2016, Darcy Burner raised \$206,750.89, according to her Oct 2017 C4 final report.

Thank you for the opportunity to respond to this matter. We hope you agree that the complaint is baseless and dismiss the complaint accordingly.
