

The following is in response to PDC Case Number 55276.

1. The complaint alleges that the campaign “Failed to file accurate, timely C4 reports.” The complaint goes on to allege that “this campaign has failed to file any C-4 reports detailing campaign expenditures.”

Response: The C4 report for the period from May 14, 2019 through May 31, 2019 was successfully transmitted to the PDC on June 10, 2019 with confirmation number 100908953. This C4 report was subsequently amended to include the in kind contribution for the filing fee (\$164.78) that was not included on the original report. The amended C4 report for the period from May 14, 2019 through May 31, 2019 was successfully transmitted to the PDC on July 26, 2019 with confirmation number 100919530. Please note that the amended C4 report was transmitted to PDC at approximately 9:05 AM PDT which was before the email transmitting the complaint from PDC Support was sent at approximately 3:50 PM.

The C4 report for the period from June 1, 2019 to July 15, 2019 was successfully transmitted to the PDC on June 28, 2019 with confirmation number 100913054. Please note that while the report was submitted early, there were no contributions received nor any expenditures made between June 29, 2019 and July 15, 2019. This C4 report was subsequently amended to include the in kind contribution for the monthly charges for two campaign email addresses (\$12.91) that was not included on the original report. The amended C4 report for the period from June 1, 2019 to July

15, 2019 was successfully transmitted to the PDC on July 27, 2019 with confirmation number 100919690.

The complaint alleges that the campaign failed to provide accurate C4 reports. One in kind contribution/expenditure was missed on each submitted C4 report but were added in the amended C4 reports.

The complaint also alleges that the campaign failed to detail campaign expenditures. This allegation is false. The submitted C4 reports clearly show detailed campaign expenditures and in kind contributions that were payments for campaign expenses.

2. The complaint alleges that the campaign did not list the filing fee as an expense.

Response: Please see response to Allegation 1.

3. The complaint alleges that the campaign failed to report the cost, the sign vendor and the number of signs purchased,

Response: This allegation is false. The C4 report for May 14, 2019 through May 31, 2019 shows an in kind contribution of \$481.62 for 50 yard signs. Because it was an in kind contribution, the ORCA software does not require the vendor to be identified. If needed by PDC the information on the vendor can be provided.

4. The complaint alleges that the campaign has purchased and distributed campaign stickers.

Response: This allegation is false. The “campaign sticker” the candidate is wearing is not a sticker but a pin-on nametag (note the safety pin that attaches it to the candidate). One can see the candidate wearing the same nametag in several pictures on the campaign’s Facebook page. The nametag is one of a kind and was printed by the campaign. The expenses for the paper and ink are listed as in kind expenses on the C4 reports.

5. The complaint alleges that the campaign has a website, website development, hosting and email services.

Response: The campaign did obtain domain registration of FriendsOfRandySlovic.com solely for email services. There is no campaign website. As such there are no expenses for website development or hosting. The submitted C4 reports show the domain registration and email expenses as in kind contributions.

6. The complaint alleges that the campaign has failed to report Facebook charges for boosted campaign posts and advertisements.

Response: The C4 report for the period from June 1, 2019 to July 15, 2019 lists an in kind contribution /expense for Facebook charges of \$250.00. Each Facebook charge is different depending on different factors. The campaign is keeping a running total of Facebook charges and approximately two thirds of the \$250.00 has been spent to

date. If the \$250.00 is exceeded, another in kind contribution will be made.

7. The complaint alleges that the campaign has failed to report bank charges and fees for the campaign bank account.

The campaign account is set up so that there are no fees or interest earned. Therefore, no reporting is required.
