To Whom It May Concern:

Christopher Rufo appears to have violated RCW 42.17A.430(4) when dissolving his campaign for Seattle City Council.

#### Violation of RCW 42.17A.430(4)

Upon dissolving his campaign, Rufo distributed remaining funds primarily to two entities: \$5600 to the Union Gospel Mission and \$10,000 to the Documentary Foundation, an organization of which Rufo is President and from which he personally received nearly \$70,000 in compensation in 2018. While the Union Gospel Mission was within the law, the contribution to the Documentary Foundation appears to have been made in violation of RCW 42.17A.430(4) as the organization is not “a charitable organization registered in accordance with 19.09 RCW,” but is rather a Washington nonprofit corporation registered, apparently, in accordance with RCW 24.03.

Evidence of the distribution of funds is found in Seattle Ethics and Elections Commission disclosures, a screenshot of and link to which is included in the attached complaint. Evidence of the Documentary Foundation’s filing status was found via the Washington Secretary of State’s charities and corporations search portal.

#### What impact does the alleged violation(s) have on the public?

Rufo, at the dissolution of his campaign, appears to have distributed surplus campaign funds in a way which is not allowed under the law, thereby potentially undermining the trust that the public has in candidates when making a contribution.
