In response to the ongoing series complaints by Glen Morgan, below you will find my response to his most recent complaint.

Membership on the Puget Sound Access Board.

During the process of reviewing Mr. Morgan's 2017 complaint regarding my volunteer membership on the board of a non-profit organization, I was informed by the PDC Compliance representative performing the review that the PDC was evaluating whether their rules even apply to an uncompensated, voluntary position on a non-profit organization. To be on the safe side, I amended my F1 in 2017.

Before filing for this year's election, I contacted the PDC to see whether a decision had been made on the applicability of PDC rules on volunteering with a non-profit. When I did not hear back, I informed Cassie Welliver, Executive Director of Puget Sound Access, that I would no longer be serving on the board, simply to avoid this issue. The Annual Report cited by Mr. Morgan was for 2018 (I was not on the SeaTac City Council at that time, and had not filed for election). I no longer serve on the Puget Sound Access Board.

Emerald City Media

In 2017 and 2018 I began acquiring video equipment with the intent of self-funding the production of a documentary film project. I have derived no income from this project. To compensate the videographers who are helping with this project, I help them find jobs and let them use my equipment. Again, I derive no income from these jobs. If there is a requirement in the F1 where personal projects of this type from which no income is derived needs to be reported, please let me know what is necessary to be in compliance and I will file an amendment.

Finally, while the documents attached to Mr. Morgan's complaint referencing an investigation from over 20 years ago while I was a police sergeant are obviously an attempt to attack my character, I must point out that the final disposition of this investigation was that I was exonerated of the initial allegation, and the whole investigation was removed from my file. I retired for service from the police department (32 years) as the Commander of Investigations and an international instructor for the International Association of Chiefs of Police, teaching Police Leadership and Ethics.
