To whom it may concern,

It has come to my attention, once again that Debbie Bertlin of the Mercer Island City Council has violated Washington State's campaign finance laws (**RCW 42.17A**).

1) Use of Public Resources in support of a political campaign. (Violation of RCW 42.17a.555)

I filed a complaint originally making this allegation with the PDC on July 21, 2019 (PDC Case #55282). However, additional evidence has come to light which further supports this allegation, which I have attached to this complaint.

According to state law (**RCW 42.17A.555**): "No elective official nor any employee of his or her office nor any person appointed to or employed by any public office or agency may use or authorize the use of any of the facilities of a public office or agency, directly or indirectly, for the purpose of assisting a campaign for election of any person to any office or for the promotion of or opposition to any ballot proposition. Facilities of a public office or agency include, but are not limited to, use of stationery, postage, machines, and equipment, use of employees of the office or agency during working hours, vehicles, office space, publications of the office or agency, and clientele lists of persons served by the office or agency."

According to Bertlin's original response to this allegation (see attached), and in her own words she stated:

"In regard to filing 55282, I confirm I did not use any phones, computers, servers, and other public facilities owned and operated by the City of Mercer Island to support my election campaign."

A similar supporting response was also made by the attorney's representing Bertlin in this matter (which is also attached).

However, these statements are false. In a recent investigation conducted by the City of Mercer Island's Ethics Board in regards to a similar ethics investigation by the Ethics Board, Bertlin was found to have misused City of Mercer Island resources in support of her campaign. Please see both the letter sent by the City of Mercer Island in regards to this ethics violation which was sent to Bertlin on August 20, 2019, and also the voting record by the Mercer Island City Council for their August 20, 2019 regular city council meeting, where you can find on the second to last item voted on by the council a unanimous vote (6-0) stating:

"To find that Mayor Bertlin violated MICC 2.60.020, specifically the City's Code of Ethics requirement to comply with RCW 42.17A.555"

It appears unambiguous that a violation of **RCW 42.17A.555** was committed by Bertlin. This was confirmed by an internal ethics investigation by City of Mercer Ethics Board. The findings were presented to the Mercer Island City Council, and they unanimously voted to find her in violation. It should be noted that Bertlin was at that council meeting and raised no objections to this vote.

2) Providing false testimony (with malice) to the PDC (Violation of RCW 42.17A.750 (2)(c))

It is apparent based on the investigation of the City of Mercer Island into this violation that both the letter from Bertlin and her legal council to the PDC as attached here were deceptive and provided in bad faith. It is equally apparent that Bertlin was willing to admit her violation after the investigation by the Ethics Board was completed, and this admission was made while at the same time Bertlin was denying the violation to the PDC, under the assumption that the PDC would never discover the results of the parallel investigation by the Mercer Island Ethics Board on the same issue.

This is a clear and unambiguous violation of **RCW 42.17A.750 (2)(c)**, and is clearly a far more serious violation of **RCW 42.17A** than the original violation of **RCW 42.17A.555**, which was detailed in the original complaint.

As an experienced long-term veteran politician (See was elected in 2011 and 2015 for this position), **she knew better than to lie to the PDC.**

While the PDC may not be inclined to pursue Class C felony charges, as allowed under this statute against Bertlin in this matter, some more tangible consequences than a "go and sin no more" letter might be in order if for no other reason than to discourage others from knowingly providing false information to the PDC.

Mayor Bertlin,

Pursuant to MICC 2.60.040, the Deputy Mayor, City Manager and City Attorney (collectively, the "Investigative Group") caused to be investigated a Mercer Island Code of Ethics violation complaint filed on July 9, 2019 against you by Carv Zwingle. In pertinent, the complaint stated the following:

"In accordance with Mercer Island City Code 2.60.040 I am respectfully requesting [...] an investigation of Mayor Bertlin's violation [of] RCW 42.17A.555 and City guidelines for her admitted use of City email account for her Campaign activities."

Under the City's code of ethics, specifically MICC 2.60.020, elected officials are expected to comply with RCW 47.17A.555. RCW 42.17A.555 prohibits, in pertinent part, elective officials from using any facilities of a public office or agency for the purpose of assisting a campaign for election. During the course of investigating the complaint, the Investigative Group reviewed an email sent by you using your City-issued @mercergov.org account to Interim City Manager Bon and Assistant to the City Manager Spietz, which read as follows:

"From: Debbie Bertlin < Debbie.Bertlin@mercergov.org> Sent: Sunday, June 30, 2019 1:12 PM To: Ali Spietz < Ali.Spietz@mercergov.org> Cc: Jessi Bon < jessi.bon@mercergov.org> Subject: MI Reporter candidate question

Primary candidates have been asked, "How do you plan to better involve residents in the decision making process within the city?" (responses due July 3)

You mentioned that you spoke to the City's limitations wrt NextDoor at the candidates' orientation. Would you please provide the same response to me in writing? Unfortunately I wasn't there and want to be sure anything I might write represents the City's position.

Accordingly, this e-mail, in whole or in part, may be subject to disclosure pursuant to Chapter 42.56 RCW, regardless of any claim of confidentiality or privilege asserted by an external party."

A violation of RCW 42.17A.555 occurs when (1) an elected official (2) uses a facility of a public agency (3) to assist a campaign for election. As a councilmember, you are an elected official. A City email account is a facility of a public agency according to guidelines issued by the PDC for local government agencies, a copy of which can be found at www.pdc.wa.gov/learn/guidelines-local-government. Lastly, based on a reasonable reading of the email, its purpose was intended to "assist a campaign for election." Consequently, the City Council finds that there was a violation of MICC 2.60.020, specifically the requirement to comply with RCW 42.17A.555, and issues this letter reminding you of your obligation as a City Official to comply with the same. Given that the financial impact of the email on the City is negligible, and it does not appear that the violation impacted the public interest in any material way or worked to the political or economic benefit or detriment to anyone, the City Council decided to take no further action.

Finally, the City Council also takes notice that it does not have jurisdiction to find an elected official in violation of RCW 42.17A.555 for purposes of civil remedies, sanctions or prosecution under chapter 42.17A RCW. Finding of violation herein is specifically limited only to the City's code of ethics.

We write to you on behalf of our client, Mayor Debbie Bertlin, in response to Glen Morgan's July 21, 2019, complaint. Glen Morgan alleges Mayor Bertlin used public resources, specifically her work email and/or city-provided computer, to manage her campaign and file documents on behalf of her campaign with the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) in violation of RCW 42.17A.555. These allegations are based on Mayor Bertlin's response to Glen Morgan's complaint in now-resolved PDC Case No. 53323.

Glen Morgan's complaint in this case misunderstands Mayor Bertlin's response to the PDC. Mayor Bertlin did not use either her work computer or her work email in attempting to file documents on behalf of her campaign. Instead, she was working from her personal cell-phone and computer. Although Mayor Bertlin has an application on her personal phone that allows her to send and receive emails from her Mercer Island account, she was not attempting to use her official email to file campaign documents. Mayor Bertlin believes that the update to her Mercer Island email application, which is hosted on her personal device, altered her security settings globally, resulting in the malfunctioning of her personal email and text message applications while out of the country.

Mayor Bertlin understands that she is not allowed to use her city-provided email or computer for campaign purposes and did not attempt to use her city-provided email or computer to manage her campaign or file documents with the PDC while she was out of the country. Thus,

the PDC should find that Glen Morgan's complaint misunderstood Mayor Bertlin's response and dismiss PDC Case No. 55282.
