Good evening,

My response is succinct and absolute.

The complaint on each count is without merit.

First, although I was an email recipient of communications intended to request contact of others in the furtherance of any House Bill or Senate Bill, I did not transmit any such requests electronically or verbally. Even the simplest observer will note that the complaint provided no evidence that I contacted any person in any way. Thus, I conducted no lobbying of any kind.

Second, in consonance with my assertion of not conducting any lobbying, I was not a sponsor of any lobbying described in RCW 42.17A.640 as I made no financial expenditures in any way and cannot in any way be subject to RCW 42.17A.640. Failure to report anything under that code is only due upon parties involved with campaigns which make expenditures. To the best of my knowledge there were no expenditures of any kind upon the subject, which certainly brings the question to light of whether a grass root lobbying campaign occurred in any way or shape.

In further response to the complaint which states "Furthermore, in support of the illegal lobbying activities, state resources including machines, software, office space, and unauthorized reimbursement using tax funds for lobbying work during regular working hours were illegally used." I must assert that as a Board Member, I have no regular working hours. All billable time is during specific case review, Committee Meetings, Special Board Meetings, and Board Meetings; during no such activities were any such communications discussed or transmitted in any way. I further assert that I have no state resources for the performance of my work on BORPELS, I have no office space, I have no software, and I have no equipment which is in any way connected with the State nor has there even been any reimbursement for such.
