Subject: Complaints regarding Malia Hollowell, PDC Cases 58718 & 58800

Dear Abraham Ritter & Joan Halbert:

The Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) has completed its review of the complaints you filed on October 15, 2019. Your complaints alleged that Malia Hollowell (the "Respondent") may have violated RCW 42.17A.320 by failing to identify the sponsor on political advertising.

PDC staff reviewed your allegations; the applicable statutes, rules, and reporting requirements; and the response provided by the Respondent to determine whether they support a finding of one or more violations.

Based on staff's review, we found the following:

- The Respondent is a candidate running for School Director for Tahoma School District 409, position 3. The Respondent registered with the PDC on May 17, 2019.
- Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.320, all written political advertising shall include the sponsor's name
 and address, which must 1) be set apart from other printed matter; 2) appear on the first page of
 the advertisement or communication; 3) be in at least 10-point type or 10% of the largest type
 used in the advertising, whichever is larger; and 4) not be subject to a half-tone or screening
 process. RCW 42.17A.005(46(a) defines "sponsor" as the person paying for the political
 advertising.
- During the 2019 election, the Respondent and fellow candidate Peter Miller co-sponsored advertising that appeared on a billboard in Maple Valley, Washington. The billboard did not include the names and addresses of the billboard's sponsors.
- The Respondent is a first-time candidate who indicated she was unaware of the sponsor identification requirements for political advertising. Upon being notified of the missing information on October 16, 2019, the Respondent immediately took steps to remedy noncompliance by contacting the billboard company the same day and instructing them to reprint the advertising.
- The revised billboard, including sponsor identification, was posted on October 25, 2019.

Mitigating factors in this case include: The Respondent's status as a first-time candidate; noncompliance was the result of a good-faith error or omission for which the Respondent quickly took corrective action; and the relatively small size or sophistication of the Respondent's campaign.

Based on these findings, staff has determined that, in this instance, failure to include sponsor identification on political advertising does not amount to a violation warranting further investigation.

PDC staff is reminding Malia Hollowell about the importance of identifying the sponsor's name and address on political advertising, including billboards.

Based on this information, the PDC finds that no further action is warranted and has dismissed this matter in accordance with RCW 42.17A.755(1).
