Dear Mark Ozias:

Enclosed is a copy of an electronic letter sent to Glen Morgan concerning a complaint filed October 21, 2019. The complaint alleges Mark Ozias may have violated RCW 42.17A.235 and 240 by failing to (1) timely and accurately report the 2015 filing fee, (2) accurately report carry forward cash from 2015 to 2019 and (3) timely and accurately provide expenditure details for election years 2015 and 2019.

As noted in the letter to Morgan, the PDC has dismissed this matter in accordance with RCW 42.17A.755(1) and will not conduct a more formal investigation into these allegations or take further enforcement action in this matter.

PDC staff is reminding you about the importance to timely disclose all contribution and expenditure activities with expenditure detail, including the filing fee. PDC staff expects in the future that you will in accordance with PDC laws and rules.

Dear Glen Morgan:

The Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) has completed its review of the complaint you filed October 21, 2019 regarding Mark Ozias.

Your complaint alleged Mark Ozias may have violated RCW 42.17A.235 and 240 by failing to (1) timely and accurately report the 2015 filing fee, (2) accurately report carry forward cash from 2015 to 2019 and (3) timely and accurately provide expenditure details for election years 2015 and 2019.

PDC staff reviewed your allegations; the applicable statutes, rules, and reporting requirements; the C-3 and C-4 reports filed by the Committee to Elect Mark Ozias and the response from Lisa Boulware, Committee Treasurer, to determine whether the record supports a finding of one or more violations.

Based on staff’s review, we found the following:

- Mark Ozias was elected to the Clallam County Commission in 2015 and re-elected in 2019.
- In a C-4 report filed January 11, 2016, the Committee listed \$32,830.20 in contributions and \$31,362.41 in expenditures during the 2015 campaign, with a balance of \$1,467.79.
- The Committee filed its initial C-4 report for the 2019 campaign on June 10, 2019 and amended the report on November 25, 2019. On the amended report, the Committee listed an initial balance of \$1,559.04.
- In the response, Boulware stated “I have found all the receipts for services and am able to offer more details about expenses but am still working on the discrepancy in the 2015 ending balance and 2019 beginning balance. I no longer have access to the bookkeeping account I used in 2015, or on-line bank statements, but requested copies from my bank and re-created the books from the 2015 campaign. In doing so, I believe I have found the discrepancy is somewhere in the expenses of \$50 or less, and possibly has something to

do with fees to PayPal being automatically deducted from the on-line donations.” She also stated the filing fee was paid out of pocket.

- On February 24, 2020, Boulware amended two C-4 reports from the 2019 campaign, reporting additional detail for expenditures to the The Sign Store and Olympic Mailing Services.
- In the response, Boulware stated “Part of my confusion was that I had indeed added the required information, only in the "memo" section rather than the "description" line, which is why it wasn't showing up on the C4 report.”
- The Committee made good faith efforts to comply with the reporting requirements of RCW 42.17A.240 concerning expenditures undertaken by the campaign on their C-4 reports. The public was not deprived of critical information as the dates, amounts, and purposes of the expenditures were disclosed, and requiring further amendments to the 2015 campaign would not have a significant or material impact on the public.

Based on these findings, staff has determined that in this instance, the failure to timely and accurately file reports of contributions and expenditures does not amount to an actual violation warranting further investigation.

PDC staff is reminding Mark Ozias and the Committee about the importance to timely disclose all contribution and expenditure activities with expenditure detail, including the filing fee, and the timely filings of all future PDC reports in accordance with the statutes and rules.

Based on this information, the PDC finds that no further action is warranted and has dismissed this matter in accordance with RCW 42.17A.755(1).
