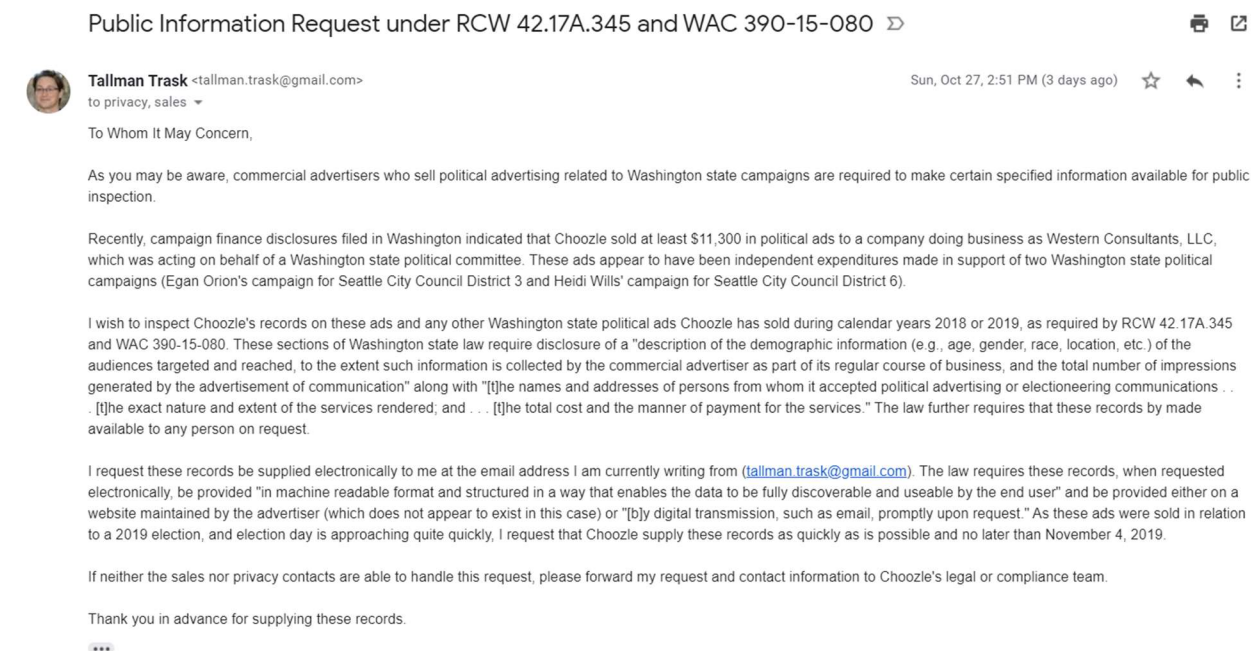

Choozle appears to potentially be in violation of at least the “promptly, upon request” requirements in both WAC 390.
