It removes accountability and masks the contributor's true motives. The laws were established because the public has a right to know by whom and for what reason they are being persuaded in an election. The public's rights were intentionally and maliciously violated in this case. 

Community Aquatics Center

- Building/On-Site Improvements: \$66.2 million
- Off-Site Improvements: \$5.8 million
- Subtotal: \$72 million

Sports Field Retrofits

- Forest Home Park Renovation: \$2.7 million
- Prune Hill Sports Park Renovation: \$2.3 million
- Dorothy Fox Park Renovation: \$1 million
- Subtotal: \$6 million

Bond Levy Total: \$78 million

If the bond is approved by voters on the November 2, 2019 ballot, in 2021 residents will pay an additional \$1.04 per \$1,000 in assessed property value. The timing of the bond will occur when other existing bonds expire, and will ease the overall financial impact on taxpayers.

Bond Levy of up to \$78 million on the Ballot November 5, 2019

The bond levy would fund the construction of a new 78,000-square-foot community aquatics center with recreational swimming pool, competitive swimming pool, gym, and community rooms. The bond levy would also fund the renovation of three existing City-owned sports fields with artificial turf, lights, and other improvements: Forest Home Park, Prune Hill Sports Park, and Dorothy Fox Park.

A local citizen by the name of David Lugliani (I did not know him previously) purchased the signs and fliers and distributed them around town before I even started the YES campaign. David was not part of my campaign, so I believe this qualifies as an “independent expenditure” as you

Independent Expenditure:

When ad appears within 21 days of an election and costs at least \$1,000, regardless of who is the sponsor:

electronically file or otherwise deliver **C-6** to the PDC within 24 hours of when the ad appears to the public.

For all other independent expenditures, unless sponsored by a political committee:**

electronically file or otherwise deliver **C-6** to the PDC within 5 days of spending \$100 or more.

*Effective July 28, 2019

**Political committees report expenditures for these independent expenditures only on the C-4 report.
