The Puget Sound Regional Council Transportation Policy Board under the Chairwomanship of Poulsbo Mayor Becky Erickson on 9 January 2020 allowed Avrum "Alex" Tsimerman candidate for Washington State Governor to make a campaign speech. Tsimerman clearly indicated he was speaking as a candidate for Governor at the beginning of his public comment, and then proceeded to give the same kinda remarks Tsimerman gives on the campaign trail that had nothing to do with what was on the Puget Sound Regional Council meeting agenda.

I am well aware RCW 42.17A.555 has nothing to do with policing hate speech and everything to do with ceasing the use of public comment for campaign purposes. HOWEVER, accepting Alex Tsimerman's campaign speech which had nothing to do with transportation and everything to do with hate is **ABSOLUTELY NOT** "Part of the normal and regular conduct of the office or agency" the exemption the PSRC may try. I encourage you to issue a reminder letter to the

Puget Sound Regional Council and make clear the next report may and should result in four if not five digit fines. When you do, please ensure <u>all</u> Puget Sound Regional Council Transportation Policy Boardmembers are notified.

Finally, I encourage you to review PDC Case #27890 to see a similar case involving Sound Transit. Thank you.

What impact does the alleged violation(s) have on the public?

Notwithstanding the moral implications of Poulsbo's Appeaser-in-Chief appeasing Alex Tsimerman hurling hate; the failure of Poulsbo's Appeaser-in-Chief to enforce RCW 42.17A.555 allows Alex Tsimerman to use Puget Sound Regional Council equipment & personnel for, "Assisting a campaign for election of any person to any office". I am also naming the PSRC Executive Director for his and/or his staff's failure to counsel Boardmembers to curtail Tsimerman's prolific outbursts.
