

## Complaint Description

As City Council member Kshama Sawant and other activist groups have spun up their "Tax Amazon" campaign, they have violated several city ordinances and state laws.

The "Tax Amazon" campaign has indeed mobilized: it has a [web site](#) (registered to Calvin Priest, a Socialist Alternative employee and Sawant's husband), and has held a string of [organizing meetings](#) over the past few weeks. At their January 25<sup>th</sup> meeting, the group [passed a resolution](#) establishing their intent to put a voter initiative on the November 2020 ballot to impose a new head tax on large companies in Seattle. The campaign is also gathering names on a [petition](#) opposing a preemption clause in HB 2907, the bill currently pending in the state legislature that would authorize King County to impose a payroll tax. The Tax Amazon campaign is also fundraising, [soliciting donations on its web site](#).

Sawant's office has been vocally supporting this effort; they have been using Sawant's [official email account](#), [constituent emailing list](#), and [city-hosted web site](#) to promote the campaign, its events, and the need for a ballot initiative. And that is the source of several violations.

Under both [Seattle](#) and [state](#) law, public resources may not be used to organize campaigns for ballot initiatives. Sawant is doing precisely that: her [web site](#) has been hosting information about the ballot initiative campaign, including promotional [posters](#) and [flyers](#), a [copy of the resolution](#) on the ballot initiative, and archives of the group's meetings.

Sawant's Council office is [listed as a co-host](#) of the campaign's events, and Sawant (listed in her official capacity as a City Council member) is a [co-chair of the ballot initiative campaign committee](#). The web site actively encourages people interested in helping the Tax Amazon campaign to call her office for assistance in getting involved.

Under [state law](#), public funds also may not be used to lobby the state government on legislative matters outside lobbying efforts officially sanctioned by the Council on behalf of the city. Since the Tax Amazon campaign is [petitioning](#) to keep preemption out of HB 2907, Sawant's Council office support for the Tax Amazon campaign violates this law as well.

The Tax Amazon campaign is also flouting state campaign disclosure laws. Since it is actively soliciting contributions, when it [officially adopted a resolution](#) to organize a ballot initiative on January 25 (and arguably before, since it was both fundraising and discussing the initiative before January 25) it was required to register with the state [Public Disclosure Commission](#) and the [Seattle Ethics and Elections Commission](#) as a political committee within 2 weeks:

under [state](#) and [Seattle](#) law, filing is required within 2 weeks of the beginning of fundraising. As of this writing, the campaign has not registered either with the PDC or the SEEC. It was also [required to register a bank depository](#) for campaign fund contributions, and it has not done that either. Needless to say, there has been no official reporting of campaign contributions.

## What impact does the alleged violation(s) have on the public?

The violations deprive the public of necessary transparency on a local ballot initiative campaign that has not registered as a political committee nor registered its depository.

The violations represent an improper use of public taxpayer funds to support a ballot initiative and to lobby the state legislature, undermining the political and legislative process in the state.

The violations represent corruption by a public official in misusing public funds under her control.

**Proposal to Jan 25, 2020 Tax Amazon Action Conference**

*We, the attendees of this first Action Conference of the Tax Amazon movement affirm the following:*

Our city is in the midst of the worst affordability crisis in its history. At the same time, our entire planet is in the midst of a climate crisis that threatens the very stability of human societies around the world. Amazon and other big corporations in Seattle make billions in profits annually, yet pay little to nothing in taxes. Ordinary people - disproportionately people of color - are bearing the brunt of both our housing and climate crises, while continuing to shoulder the overwhelming burden of taxation for the services we desperately need.

In last year's City Council elections, working people roundly rejected Amazon's attempts to buy City Hall while a post-election poll showed 75% support for taxing big business. In the context of deep inequality, Trump's corporate tax cuts, and a highly regressive Washington State tax system, there is growing recognition the billionaires need to pay their fair share!

This is why our Tax Amazon 2020 movement is fighting for a tax on our city's biggest corporations to fund a major expansion of social housing — publicly-owned, high quality, permanently affordable, green and energy-efficient homes for working people, built by union labor — as part of a broader Green New Deal.



## SIGN THE PETITION: TAX BIG BUSINESS, NOT WORKING PEOPLE. NO BAN ON PROGRESSIVE TAXATION!

Ordinary people in Seattle are facing the worst affordable housing crisis in our city's history. Even a recent Chamber of Commerce-funded report estimates that \$450 million to \$1.1 billion is needed each year to address King County's affordable housing crisis. On the heels of powerful grassroots momentum to Tax Amazon and big business on a scale commensurate with the gravity of the crisis, the political establishment and big business are pushing the newly introduced House Bill 2907 as an alternative. While any serious efforts to build affordable housing with progressive funding should be welcomed, we cannot let this bill stop our movement to make big business pay its fair share.

HB 2907 would provide *far too little* for the scale of the crisis. It would shamefully block people in Seattle and other cities from raising the progressive funding necessary to address the housing crisis. It would be yet another attack on working people in a state with the nation's most regressive tax system.

*I oppose any attempt to undermine our movement with a state ban on progressive taxation. I stand with the Tax Amazon movement, which is fighting to tax Seattle's wealthiest businesses to fund Social Housing and a Green New Deal.*


