Candidate failed to follow the Candidate Public Disclosure Rule: "Once I become a candidate, then what? Within two weeks of the date you become a candidate, you must file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1) and a Candidate Registration with the PDC, if required. Candidates for state or local office should refer to the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission for reporting requirements. An incumbent officeholder who has filed an F-1 earlier in the year does not need to file a second F-1 in the same year after becoming a candidate." Candidate announced in the paper on 2/24/2020 that he was running for County Commissioner and has failed to comply with PDC filing within 14 days. I have a screen shot of all the candidates who have filed for these positions. To date only Arne Mortensen shows as having filed for a BOCC position (see attached). Thank you.

**What impact does the alleged violation(s) have on the public?**

Failure to disclose, lack of transparency.
