He filed for the position on May 11<sup>th</sup>, 2020 per VoteWA (see attached). He failed to file his C1 form within the required two weeks. More troubling is his continued lack of F1 filing. If elected, he will be setting policy for Benton County. As a local builder, conflicts of interest are a distinct possibility. Identifying potential problems is problematic without the transparency of a financial affairs filing.</p>
<b>What impact does the alleged violation(s) have on the public?</b>
The lack of information prevents the public from assessing potential conflicts of interest. The late C1 is a minor issue. But when coupled with the missing F1, it appears disingenuous that Mr. McKay could recognize his lack of C1 form but totally ignore the missing F1.

Screen shot 3 shows (as of Sept. 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020) William D McKay Jr had not submitted an F1. It should be noted that there is 'name' issue. Candidate McKay's father is William Dean McKay and he serves on Kennewick City Council. The F1 filings (2017, 2018, 2019, and 2020) are all from Councilman McKay. I would point out that I contacted the PDC in August to make sure that there was not a problem due to similar names i.e. Candidate McKay's F1 being electronically conflated with Councilman McKay's F1. Staff, using an internal search function verified that Candidate McKay had not submitted an F1.
