Under WAC 390-05-290, the term "political advertising" includes "mass communications" which in turn is defined as "one hundred or more letters, emails, text messages or similar communications that are identical or substantially similar..." Under RCW 42.17A.320(1), political advertising must include the sponsor's address. There is no address in this text message. Guilty, Guilty, Guilty.
<b>What impact does the alleged violation(s) have on the public?</b>
First Amendment aside, people who send unsolicited text messages should be subjected to public caning. But we also can't do that because of the Eighth Amendment, so the next best thing is PDC complaints when they violate the rules on political advertising
