This matter was heard remotely by the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission (Commission) on February 25, 2021, by telephonic and online streaming access. Mary Tompkins (Respondent) requested review of the Presiding Officer's Order issued on December 17, 2020, following a Brief Enforcement Hearing (Brief Adjudicative Proceeding) in this matter. The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC.

Commissioners present both telephonically and online were Fred Jarrett, Commission Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; Commissioner Bill Downing, and Commissioner Russell Lehman. Also present both telephonically and online were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General Chad Standifer, representing PDC Staff, and Tabatha Blacksmith, PDC Compliance Coordinator. Respondent Mary Tompkins did not appear on her own behalf. The proceeding was open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-28 *et seq.* and recorded.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involved Respondent's request that the Commission review an Initial Order issued on January 11, 2021, resulting from an Initial Hearing on December 17, 2020, regarding Mary Tompkins, a City Council Member for the City of Milton, for the term January 1, 2019, through November 5, 2019. The Respondent has no prior violations with the PDC. The Presiding Officer at the Brief Adjudicative Proceeding found the Respondent in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) no later than April 15, 2020, as required. At the December 17, 2020, Brief Enforcement Hearing an Order imposing a \$250 penalty was entered, which the Respondent requests the Commission review.

The basis of Respondent's Request for Review was that she believed the report had been filed and confirmed this with PDC staff, that filing was not required since she lost the election, and that she had ongoing U.S. Post Office delivery issues.

Between February and May of 2020, PDC staff sent nine emails to elected and 1. appointed officials reminding them of their responsibility to file F-1 reports. These reminders were sent to the contact emails provided by filers on their PDC reports. From July 27, 2020, through October 7, 2020, PDC staff also began contacting elected

- 7. On January 11, 2021, PDC staff served the Initial Order memorializing the Commission's ruling by electronic mail and U.S. mail to the contact email address and U.S. mail address provided by the Respondent.
- 8. PDC staff served Respondent with a hearing notice on February 11, 2021 for the February 25, 2021 Review Hearing.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 42.17A RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.

III. ORDER

As a result of Respondent's filing of the required F-1 report prior to the Review Hearing, and after consideration of the mitigating and aggravating factors of this matter, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the \$250 civil penalty assessed at the December 17, 2020, Initial Hearing is VACATED. This Order on Review will be the Final Order.

1. The \$250 sent by the Respondent and deposited by the PDC pursuant to PDC office procedures shall be refunded by PDC staff to the Respondent.
