## Response to alleged violations by “Retain Sheriff Hatcher”

### Response as to your specific questions

- 1 To the best of my recollection early August 2020 was when donations were first received.  
A: facebook and in person.  
B: Early August I believe, the first bank deposit was 8/13/20
- 2 The first date of expense was 09/29/20  
A: Shirts  
B: 72

- 3 The facebook pages were set by Rebecca and revolve around the recall issue, as a way to keep the public informed about what is going on. These are not specifically for fundraising.
- 4 These signs are and were used in Sheriff Hatcher's last campaign. As such I cannot answer this.

In response to the allegations that donations received and expenses paid are being hidden

I assumed that the Recall would be run under Sheriff Hatcher's old campaign. At the time I was made aware by the PDC that a new campaign would need to be filed I followed their instructions and filed the new campaign which was approved December 1, 2020.

If the recall effort had been unsuccessful in court any funds gathered would have been donated per PDC rules to a 501 C3 charity. Sheriff Hatcher has yet to name this charity.

I have at this point lumped all donations into the filing date of 12/01/20 these were all collected before that date

As this allegation names Lisa Thomas as a person involved in the effort to retain sheriff Hatcher she is not “officially” part of the group. As social media is used as part of the effort many people have suggested that people help out, just as she did.

In short I accept responsibility for the late filings as this is all new to me.

At this time I am working through the requisite filings, and expect them to be finished today, barring any new computer problems.

It is my intent to make sure all filings are complete and filed in a timely manner.
