The \$200 non-suspended portion of the penalty is due within 30 days of the date of the Final Order.

FINAL ORDER ON REQUEST FOR RECONSIDERATION

This matter was heard by the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission (Commission) on August 26, 2021, by telephonic and online streaming access. Washington Court Reporters Association (Respondent), requested review of the Presiding Officer's Order issued on July 1, 2021, following a Brief Enforcement Hearing (Brief Adjudicative Proceeding) in this matter. The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC.

Commissioners present were Fred Jarrett, Commission Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioner William Downing. Also present both telephonically and online were Assistant Attorney General Matthew Kernutt representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General Chad Standifer, representing PDC Staff, and Jennifer Hansen, PDC Compliance Officer. The Respondent did not appear on its own behalf. The proceeding was open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-28 *et seq.* and recorded.

The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

- Case memorandum dated August 18, 2021, prepared by Tabitha Townsend, PDC Compliance Officer;
- 2. Warning Letter, PDC Case #91597, served April 5, 2021;
- 3. Brief Enforcement Hearing Notice, PDC Case #91597, served electronically June 2, 2021, and by U.S. Postal mail June 1, 2021;
- 4. Initial Order Imposing Fine, PDC Case #91597, entered July 30, 2021;
- 5. L-3 reports, PDC Case #91597, covering calendar years 2019 and 2020, filed August 3, 2021;
- 6. Respondent's written Request for Reconsideration, dated August 5, 2021;
- 7. Reconsideration Hearing Notice, PDC Case #91597, served August 18, 2021.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

This matter involves the Washington Court Reporters Association (Respondent), a lobbyist employer who first registered with the PDC in December, 2019. The Respondent is currently contracted to lobby through the end of December, 2022. During a Brief Enforcement Hearing held on July 1, 2021, Respondent was found to have violated RCW 42.17A.630 for failure to timely file a Lobbyist Employer Annual Expense report with the PDC. The report disclosing 2019 and 2020 lobbying activities was due to be filed no later than March 2, 2020, and March 1, 2021, respectively. At the Brief Enforcement Hearing an Order imposing a \$250 per report penalty (\$500 total) was entered.

- 1. The L-3 report is required by RCW 42.17A.630 to be filed no later than the end of February of each calendar year, disclosing lobbying activities in the previous calendar year.
- 2. The Respondent's L-3 report disclosing lobbying activity in calendar year 2019 was due to be filed no later than March 2, 2020.

- 3. The Respondent's L-3 report disclosing lobbying activity in calendar year 2020 was due to be filed no later than March 1, 2021.
- 4. On March 16, 2021, PDC staff sent reminders to all lobbyist employers reminding them of their past due responsibility to file an L-3 report for calendar year 2020. These reminder notices were sent to the contact emails provided by filers in the electronic lobbyist filing application.
- 5. On April 5, 2021, PDC staff sent warning letters by U.S. Mail to all lobbyist employers warning them to file their overdue L-3 reports no later than May 5, 2021, to avoid potential enforcement action and fines. The warning letters were mailed to the addresses provided by filers in the electronic lobbyist filing application.
- 6. On June 2, 2021, PDC staff emailed a hearing notice for a July 1, 2021, Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing) to Respondents at pclykken@gmail.com.
- 7. The hearing notice was also sent by U.S. Mail to "917 Triple Crown Way, Suite 200, Yakima WA 98908." Both notices offered the Respondent an opportunity to sign a Statement of Understanding, file the missing reports, and pay a \$100 civil penalty no later than June 23, 2021, to avoid an enforcement hearing.
- 8. At the Brief Enforcement Hearing held on July 1, 2021, the Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.630 for failure to timely file the L-3 reports no later than March 2, 2020, and March 1, 2021, respectively. Respondent was assessed a \$250 penalty per report (\$500 total), consistent with WAC 390-37-143, the Brief Enforcement Hearing penalty schedule adopted by the Commission.
- 9. On August 2, 2021, PDC staff served the Initial Order to pclykken@gmail.com, the contact email address originally provided in the electronic lobbyist employer filing application. On July 30, 2021, the Order was also sent by U.S. Mail to "917 Triple Crown Way, Suite 200, Yakima WA 98908."
 - 10. On August 3, 2021, the Respondent filed the missing L-3 reports for calendar

years 2019 and 2020, including disclosure of candidate contributions and lobbyist compensation.

- 11. On August 5, 2021, PDC staff received an email request to review the penalty assessed at the July 1, 2021, hearing of \$250 per report (\$500 total).
- 12. On August 18, 2021, PDC staff served the Respondent with a hearing notice for an August 26, 2021, Reconsideration Hearing before the Public Disclosure Commission, along with instructions on how to participate in the hearing remotely.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter
 42.17A RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the
 Administrative procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
- 2. The Respondent violated RCW 42.17A.630 by failing to timely file L-3 reports for calendar years 2019 and 2020 that were due no later than March 2, 2020, and March 1, 2020, respectively.

III. ORDER

The Request for Reconsideration is GRANTED. This Order on Reconsideration will be the Final Order. The Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law are AFFIRMED and the \$500 civil penalty assessed by the July 1, 2021, Initial Order is MODIFIED as follows:

- 1. The Respondent shall pay a total civil penalty of \$500 with \$300 suspended on the following conditions:
 - a. Respondent is not found to have committed any further violations of Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC, within four years of the date of

the Final Order in this matter. The suspended penalty shall not be 1 2 assessed based solely upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or 3 error classified by the Commission as appropriate to address by a 4 technical correction. 5 The Respondent is in compliance with all reporting requirements. b. 6 The non-suspended portion of the penalty (\$200) is paid by the c. 7 Respondent within 30 days of the date of the Final Order in this matter 8 or as arranged by the PDC in regular installments.
