FINAL ORDER ON RECONSIDERATION

This matter was heard at a Special Meeting of the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission (Commission) on October 12, 2021, by telephonic and online streaming access. Dale Thornton (Respondent), requested reconsideration of the Presiding Officer's Order, issued following a Brief Enforcement Hearing (Brief Adjudicative Proceeding) held July 15, 2021. The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC.

Commissioners present were Fred Jarrett, Commission Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners William Downing and Allen Hayward. Also present both telephonically and online were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General Chad Standifer, representing PDC Staff, and Tabitha Townsend, PDC Compliance Coordinator. The Respondent was provided notice and did not appear on his own behalf. The proceeding was open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-28 *et seq.* and recorded.

The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

This matter involves Dale Thornton (Respondent), a School Director for Kiona Benton School District 052, during calendar year 2020. During a Brief Enforcement Hearing held on July 15, 2021, Respondent was found to have violated RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) no later than April 15, 2021. At the Brief Enforcement Hearing an Order imposing a \$300 civil fine, with \$150 suspended, was entered.

- 1. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an elected or appointed official who held office in 2020 was required to file an F-1 report, disclosing financial information for calendar year 2020, no later than April 15, 2021.
- 2. The Respondent has one prior violation of RCW 42.17A.700 with the PDC, Case 80188. The prior F-1 was for calendar year 2019 and was due April 15, 2020. Respondent paid the penalty on February 18, 2021, and the CY 2019 F-1 was filed on July 2, 2021.
- 3. Between February and May of 2021, PDC staff sent email reminders to all elected and appointed officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2020. The notice was sent to the Respondent's email address of record.
 - 4. On May 11, 2021, PDC staff emailed warning letters to elected and appointed

officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2020.

- 5. On June 28, 2021, PDC staff emailed a hearing notice for a July 15, 2021, Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing) to Respondent's email address of record.
- 6. At the Brief Enforcement Hearing held on July 15, 2021, the Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file the F-1 report no later than April 15, 2021. Respondent was assessed a \$300 penalty consistent with WAC 390-37-143, the Brief Enforcement Hearing penalty schedule adopted by the Commission. The Presiding Officer suspended \$150 of the \$300 penalty conditioned upon the Respondent filing the missing F-1 report and paying the non-suspended \$150 penalty within 30 days of the Initial Order being served.
- 7. On August 16, 2021, PDC staff served the Initial Order to the Respondent's email address of record.
- 8. On August 16, 2021, Respondent submitted written materials to PDC staff appealing the July 15, 2021, Initial Order based on the fact he had medical issues and was unaware of the hearing or the penalty.
- 9. PDC staff emailed Respondent the Reconsideration Hearing Notice on October 4, 2021, along with instructions on how to participate in the October 12, 2021, hearing remotely.
- 10. The Respondent filed the missing F-1 report covering calendar year 2020 activity on July 2, 2021.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter
42.17A RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the
Administrative procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.

2. 1 The Respondent violated RCW 42.17A.700 by failing to timely file the F-1 2 report for calendar year 2020 that was due no later than April 15, 2021. 3 4 III. **ORDER** 5 The Request for Reconsideration is DENIED. This order shall be the Final Order.
