4 5 **BEFORE THE PUBLIC DISCLOSURE COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON** In Re: The Matter of Enforcement Action PDC CASE NO. 94021 Against: 8 FINAL ORDER 9 JAMES M. FELTON, Respondent. 12 This matter was heard remotely by the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission 14 (Commission) on September 23, 2021, by telephonic and online streaming access. Respondent requested review of the Initial Order within 21 calendar days of the order being served on him. 16 The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC. Commissioners present both telephonically and online were Fred Jarrett, Commission Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; Commissioner Bill Downing, and 20 Commissioner Allen Hayward. Also present both telephonically and online were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General Chad Standifer, representing PDC Staff, and Jennifer Hansen, PDC Compliance Officer. 23 Respondent James M. Felton and his spouse Susan Felton appeared on his behalf. 24 proceeding was open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-28 et seq. and recorded.

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2	The Commissioners had before them the following materials:		
3	1. Case memorandum dated September 15, 2021, prepared by Jennifer Hansen, PDC

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6	2. Brief Enforcement Hearing Notice, PDC Case 94021, sent to Respondent on June 25,		
7	2021, for Adjudicative Proceedings on July 15, 2021;		
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9	3. Initial Order Imposing Fine, PDC Case 94021, entered August 16, 2021;		
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11	4. PDC staff email, dated August 18, 2021, memorializing verbal request for review;		
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13	5. Reconsideration Hearing Notice, PDC Case 94021, served September 15, 2021, and		
14	the corrected notice served September 17, 2021.		
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16	I. FINDINGS OF FACT		
17	The matter involves an alleged violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a		
18	Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) no later than April 15, 2021, for calendar year		
19	2020.		
20	1. James M. Felton served as School Director for Pioneer School District 402 for		
21	the term January 1, 2019, through February 11, 2021, when he resigned due to medical		
22	reasons. The Respondent has no prior violations with the PDC.		
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24	2. Between February and May of 2021, PDC staff sent email reminders to all elected		
25	and appointed officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2020.		
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2	3. On May 11, 2021, PDC staff emailed warning letters to elected and appointed		
3	officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2020.		
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5	4. On June 25, 2021, PDC staff emailed the Respondent a hearing notice for a		
6	Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing) to be held on July 15,		
7	2021. The hearing notice was sent to the Respondent's email address of record.		
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9	5. At the July 15, 2021, Brief Enforcement Hearing the Respondent was found in		
10	violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file the F-1 report no later than Apr		
11	15, 2021, and was assessed a \$250 penalty, consistent with WAC 390-37-143, the Brie		
12	Enforcement Hearing penalty schedule adopted by the Commission.		
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14	6. On August 16, 2021, PDC staff served the Initial Order memorializing the		
15	Commission's ruling by email to the contact email address of record.		
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17	7. To date the Respondent has not filed an F-1 report covering calendar year 2020		
18	activity.		
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20	8. On August 18, 2021, Respondent's spouse contacted PDC staff by telephone to		
21	appeal her husband's August 16, 2021, order based on Mr. Felton's significant health		
22	issues that prevented him from completing the F-1 report. Ms. Felton indicated her		
23	intention to assist her husband in filing the F-1 report.		
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25	9. PDC staff emailed the Respondent and his spouse on August 18, 2021, and		
26	informed them that a hearing would be scheduled pursuant to their request. Ms. Felton		

1	was also directed to contact a Customer Service Representative for assistance in filing		
2	the missing F-1 report.		
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4	10. On September 15, 2021, PDC staff served Respondent and his spouse by email		
5	with a hearing notice for a September 23, 2021, Hearing on Reconsideration before the		
6	Commission, along with instructions on how to participate in the hearing remotely. On		
7	September 17, 2021, staff served the Respondent and his spouse with a corrected		
8	hearing notice to reflect the appropriate agenda time.		
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10	II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW		
11	1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter		
12	42.17A RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the		
13	Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.		
14	Administrative Flocedure Act, and Thie 330 WAC.		
15	2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an elected or appointed official who held office		
16	in 2020 was required to file an F-1 report, disclosing financial information for calendar		
17	year 2020, no later than April 15, 2021.		
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19	III. ORDER		
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21	After consideration of the mitigating and aggravating factors, including Respondent's		
22	significant health issues, and the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Commission		
23	VACATES the Initial Order assessing a civil penalty of \$250 for late filing of the F-1 report in		
24	violation of RCW 42.17A.700. This Order will be the Final Order.		
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1	1. Respondent and his spouse shall	work with PDC staff to file the missing F-1	
2	report for calendar year 2020 as soon as Respondent's health permits.
