FINAL ORDER

This matter was heard remotely by the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission (Commission) on September 23, 2021, by telephonic and online streaming access. Respondent requested review of the Initial Order within 21 calendar days of the order being served on him. The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC.

Commissioners present both telephonically and online were Fred Jarrett, Commission Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; Commissioner Bill Downing, and Commissioner Allen Hayward. Also present both telephonically and online were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General Chad Standifer, representing PDC Staff, and Jennifer Hansen, PDC Compliance Officer. Respondent Charles (Rick) Hughes appeared on his own behalf. The proceeding was open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-28 *et seq.* and recorded.

- 3. On May 11, 2021, PDC staff emailed warning letters to elected and appointed officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2020.
- 4. On June 25, 2021, PDC staff emailed the Respondent a hearing notice for a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing) to be held on July 15, 2021. The hearing notice was sent to the Respondent's email address of record.
- 5. At the July 15, 2021, Brief Enforcement Hearing the Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file the F-1 report no later than April 15, 2021, and was assessed a \$250 penalty, consistent with WAC 390-37-143, the Brief Enforcement Hearing penalty schedule adopted by the Commission.
- 6. On August 16, 2021, PDC staff served the Initial Order memorializing the Commission's ruling by email to the contact email address of record.
- 7. Respondent filed the F-1 report covering calendar year 2020 activity on June 29, 2021.
- 8. On September 8, 2021, the Respondent submitted written materials to PDC Staff to appeal the August 16, 2021, Order based on the fact he has been serving as a frontline worker responding to the COVID-19 pandemic and continued to do so throughout the filing period. He stated he inadvertently missed the earlier emailed notices regarding the enforcement action.
- 9. On September 15, 2021, PDC staff served Respondent by email with a hearing notice for a September 23, 2021, Hearing on Reconsideration before the Commission,

1 along with instructions on how to participate in the hearing remotely. On September 2 17, 2021, staff served the Respondent with a corrected hearing notice to reflect the 3 appropriate agenda time. 4 5 II. **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW** 1. 6 The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 7 42.17A RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the 8 Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC. 9 2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an elected or appointed official who held office 10 11 in 2020 was required to file an F-1 report, disclosing financial information for calendar 12 year 2020, no later than April 15, 2021. 13 III. **ORDER** 14 15 After consideration of the mitigating and aggravating factors, including Respondent's significant challenges as a COVID-19 frontline worker, and the Findings of Fact and 16 17 Conclusions of Law, the Commission VACATES the Initial Order assessing a civil penalty of \$250 for late filing of the F-1 report in violation of RCW 42.17A.700.
