Respondent 16 Lenett James requested reconsideration of the Presiding Officer's Order entered on August 12, 17 2021, following a Brief Enforcement Hearing (Brief Adjudicative Proceeding) on July 15, 2021, 18 in this matter. The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and 19 Chapter 390-37 WAC. 20 Commissioners present both telephonically and online were Fred Jarrett, Commission 21 Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners William 22 Downing and Allen Hayward. Also present both telephonically and online were Assistant 23 Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General 24 Chad Standifer representing PDC Staff, and Tabatha Blacksmith, PDC Compliance Coordinator. 25

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Notice was provided to the Respondent and she appeared on her own behalf. The proceeding

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was open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-25 et. seq. and recorded.

The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

- Case memorandum dated January 27, 2022, prepared by Tabatha Blacksmith, PDC Compliance Coordinator;
- Brief Enforcement Hearing Notice, served June 29, 2021;
- Initial Order Imposing Fine, entered August 12, 2021;
- Respondent's written request for review, received December 3, 2021;
- Respondent's F-1 report filed December 27, 2021;
- Reconsideration Hearing Notice, served January 13, 2022.

## I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involved Respondent's request that the Commission reconsider an Initial Order entered on August 12, 2021, resulting from an Initial Hearing on July 15, 2021, regarding Lenett James, a School Director for Mary Walker School District 207 during calendar year 2020. The Presiding Officer at the Brief Adjudicative Proceeding found the Respondent in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) with the Public Disclosure Commission no later than April 15, 2021. At the July 15, 2021, hearing, an Order was entered imposing a \$250 penalty, with \$150 suspended, which the Respondent now requests the Commission reconsider. The Respondent has no prior violations with the PDC.

1. In March and April of 2021, PDC staff sent email reminders to all elected and appointed officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2020.

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2	2.	On May 12, 2021, PDC staff emailed the Respondent a warning notice
		regarding the mission F-1 report. The notice was sent to the Respondent's
3		official email address of record.
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5	3.	On June 29, 2021, PDC staff emailed the Respondent a hearing notice for a
6		Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing) to be held on July
7		15, 2021. The hearing notice was sent to the Respondent's email address of
8		record, including an official and personal email address.
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11	4.	At the Brief Enforcement Hearing held on July 15, 2021, the Respondent was
12		found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file the missing F-1
13		Report no later than April 15, 2021, and was assessed a \$250 penalty consistent
14		with WAC 390-37-143, the Brief Enforcement Hearing penalty schedule
		adopted by the Commission. The Presiding Office suspended \$150 of the \$250
15		penalty conditioned upon the Respondent filing the missing F-1 report and
16		paying the non-suspended \$100 penalty within 30 days of the Initial Order
17		being entered.
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19	5.	On August 17, 2021, the Respondent was served with the August 12, 2021,
20		Initial Order memorializing the Commission's ruling to the Respondent's email
21		address of record.

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24	6.	Respondent filed the missing F-1 Report on December 27, 2021.
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1	7.	On December 3, 2021, the Respondent spoke to PDC staff by telephone and		
2		indicated she was not required to file an F-1 Report. She further indicated her		
3		official email address was no longer working, her home wi-fi coverage was		
4		poor, and that a family member had been hospitalized.		
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6	8.	On December 3, 2021 PDC staff received a written request for reconsideration		
7		of the August 12, 2021, Initial Order based upon the Respondent's "devasta		
8		medical circumstances."		
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10	9.	On January 13, 2022, PDC staff served the Respondent by email with a hearing		
11		notice for a January 27, 2022 Reconsideration Hearing before the Public		
12		Disclosure Commission, along with instructions on how to participate in the		
13		hearing remotely.

2	This Order on Reconsideration will be the Final Order. After consideration of the			
3	mitigating and aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the			
4	Initial Hearing Order assessing a \$250 civil penalty, with \$150 suspended, is MODIFIED as			
5	follows:

7	1. Respondent Lenett James is assessed a total civil penalty of \$250, with \$25 suspended, on the following conditions:			
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9	a. The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC reporting			
10	requirements and is not found to have committed any further violations of			
11	Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date of this Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be assessed based sole			
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13	upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified by the			
14	Commission as appropriate to address by a technical correction.			
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16	2. If the Respondent fails to remain in compliance, the suspended civil penalty			
17	\$250 will immediately become due without further action by the Commission.
