Respondent 16 William (Beau) Burkett was provided notice on October 14, 2021, of the hearing date. The 17 hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 18 WAC. 19 Commissioners present both telephonically and online were Fred Jarrett, Commission 20 Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners William 21 Downing and Allen Hayward. Also present both telephonically and online were Assistant 22 Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General 23 Chad Standifer representing PDC Staff, and Tabitha Townsend, PDC Compliance Coordinator. 24 Notice was provided to the Respondent and he did not appear on his own behalf. The proceeding 25

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was open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-25 et. seq. and recorded.

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The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

- Order Imposing Fine, PDC Case 10036, for missing F-1 CY 2015, dated February 7, 2017;
- 8. WAC 390-37-182, Penalty Schedule.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involves Respondent William (Beau) Burkett, a candidate for Mayor of the City of Buckley in the 2021 Election Cycle. Respondent is alleged to have violated RCW 42.17A.205 for failure to timely file a Candidate Registration (C-1 Report) and RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) with the Public Disclosure Commission no later than June 4, 2021, disclosing financial information for the prior twelve months. The Respondent has four prior violations with the PDC and the case was brought before the full Commission for review.

1. The current C-1 and F-1 Reports were filed on October 27, 2021.

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- 2. Written testimony was provided by the Respondent on October 28, 2021 and read into the record.
- 3. There is currently an outstanding balance owing of \$2,850 from penalties assessed on four prior cases for violations of RCW 42.17A.700:
 - PDC Case 80176. At a February 25, 2021, Enforcement
 Hearing, Respondent was found in violation of RCW
 42.17A.700 for failing to file F-1 reports for calendar years 2018
 and 2019, which were due not later than April 15, 2019, and
 April 15, 2020, respectively. A total civil penalty of \$1,000 was
 assessed in accordance with the penalty schedule adopted by the
 Commission that was in effect at that time.
 - PDC Case 38794. At an October 25, 2018, Brief Enforcement Hearing, Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 by failing to file an F-1 report for calendar year 2017, that was due not after than April 16, 2018. A civil penalty of \$500 was assessed in accordance with the penalty schedule adopted by the Commission that was in effect at that time.
 - PDC Case 22221. At an August 23, 2017, Brief Enforcement
 Hearing, Respondent was found in violation of RCW
 42.17A.700 by failing to file an F-1 report for calendar year
 2016, that was due not later than April 17, 2017. A civil penalty
 of \$1,000 was assessed in accordance with the penalty schedule
 adopted by the Commission that was in effect at that time.

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- PDC Case 10036. At a January 20, 2017, Brief Enforcement
 Hearing, Respondent was found in violations of RCW
 42.17A.700 by failing to file an F-1 report for calendar year
 2015, that was due not later than April 15, 2016. A civil Penalty
 of \$250 was assessed in accordance with the F-1 penalty
 schedule adopted by the Commission that was in effect at that
 time.
- PDC Case 16-242. A civil penalty was assessed of \$100.
- 4. On October 14, 2021, PDC staff served the Respondent, by mail, with a hearing notice for an October 28, 2021, Enforcement Hearing along with instructions on how to participate in the hearing remotely. On October 18, 2021, PDC Staff served the Respondent by email with the same notice.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter
 42.17A. RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05
 RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
- 2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.205, a candidate for election year 2021, was required to file a C-1 Report within two weeks of candidacy or no later than June 4, 2021.
- 3. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, a candidate for election year 2021 was required to file an F-1 Report, disclosing financial information for the prior twelve months, within two weeks of candidacy or no later than June 4, 2021

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2	III. ORDER
3	This Order will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating and
4	aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Commission
5	assesses a civil penalty of \$500 for the late filed C-1 Report and \$1000 for the late filed F-1
6	Report for a total civil fine of \$1,500.
7	Report for a total civil fine of \$1,300.
8	a. Payment of the civil fine shall be made in full within 30 days of the
9	issuance of this order. If payment is not made within 30 days of the
10	issuance of this order, the amount owing may be sent to collection
11	without further action of the Commission.

13	b. The Respondent shall remain in full compliance with all PDC reporting
14	requirements and not be found to have committed any further violations
15	of Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date
16	of this Final Order.
