1 2 3 4 5 BEFORE THE PUBLIC DISCLOSURE COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON 6 7 In Re: The Matter of Enforcement Action PDC CASE NO. 95251 Against: 8 FINAL ORDER ON REQUEST FOR RECONSIDERATION 9 EDGAR OOMS, 10 Respondent. 11 12 This matter was heard at the Regular Meeting of the Washington State Public Disclosure 13 Commission (Commission) on October 28, 2021, by telephonic and online streaming access. 14 Edgar Ooms (Respondent) requested reconsideration of the Presiding Officer's Order, issued 15 following a Brief Enforcement Hearing (Brief Adjudicative Proceeding) held August 12, 2021. 16 The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 17 WAC. 18 Commissioners present were Fred Jarrett, Commission Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, 19 Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners William Downing and Allen Hayward. Also 20 present both telephonically and online were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader 21 representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General Chad Standifer, representing PDC 22 Staff, and Tabatha Blacksmith, PDC Compliance Coordinator. The Respondent appeared on his 23 own behalf. The proceeding was open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-24 28 et seq. and recorded. 25 The Commissioners had before them the following materials: 26

- Case memorandum dated October 28, 2021, prepared by Tabatha Blacksmith, PDC Compliance Coordinator;
- 2. Brief Enforcement Hearing Notice, served July 22, 2021;
- 3. Respondent's emails and PDC responses dated July 19, 2021, through July 22, 2021;
- 4. Initial Order Imposing Fine, issued September 13, 2021;
- 5. Candidate information from the Secretary of State for Rainier School District 307, voter count, jurisdiction map, and candidacy details.
- 6. Respondent's request for reconsideration and related emails, received August 12, 2021, through October 13, 2021;
- 7. Reconsideration Hearing Notice, served October 18, 2021.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

This matter involves Edgar Ooms (Respondent), a candidate for School Director for Rainier School District 307 during election year 2021. During a Brief Enforcement Hearing held on August 12, 2021, Respondent was found to have violated RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) within two weeks of becoming a candidate or no later than June 4, 2021. At the Brief Enforcement Hearing an Order imposing a \$250 civil fine, with \$125 suspended, was entered. The Respondent has no prior violations of RCW 42.17A.700 with the PDC.

- 1. In May and June of 2021, PDC staff sent email reminders to all candidates for election year 2021 regarding their missing F-1 reports.
- 2. On June 16, 2021, PDC staff emailed the Respondent a warning notice regarding the missing F-1 report. The notice was sent to Respondent's email address-of-record.
- 3. On July 22, 2021, PDC staff emailed a hearing notice for a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing), to be held on August 12, 2021, to Respondent's email address-of-record.

4. On July 22, 2021, PDC staff responded to two emails from the Respondent where he stated his belief that he was not required to file an F-1 report because his jurisdiction had less than 2000 registered voters. PDC staff informed him that Rainier School District 307 had 4,120 registered voters in the 2020 general election and an F-1 report was required.

- 5. Between August 12, 2021, and October 13, 2021, Respondent sent a series of emails disputing the reporting requirements.
- 6. On September 15, 2021, PDC staff served the Initial Order memorializing the Commission's ruling, by email, to the Respondent's contact email address-of-record.
- 7. On October 5, 2021, PDC staff received an email requesting the case be reconsidered based upon the Respondent's uncertainty of how jurisdiction for reporting requirements is determined.
- 8. On October 18, 2021, PDC staff served Respondent, by email, with a hearing notice for an October 28, 2021 Reconsideration hearing before the Commission, along with instructions on how to participate in the hearing remotely.
- 9. Rainier School District has 4,120 registered voters according to the 2020 Election Database information from the Secretary of State. There are five School Director positions within the District. The Respondent is a candidate for Position Four.
- 10. As of the date of this hearing, the F-1 report has not been filed covering the prior twelve months financial activity.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter
 42.17A RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the
 Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.

2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, a candidate for office in 2021 was required to file
