Respondent 16 Melvin Taylor requested review of the Presiding Officer's Order entered on September 13, 2021, 17 following a Brief Enforcement Hearing (Brief Adjudicative Proceeding) on August 12, 2021, in 18 this matter. The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and 19 Chapter 390-37 WAC. 20 Commissioners present both telephonically and online were Fred Jarrett, Commission 21 Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners William 22 Downing and Allen Hayward. Also present both telephonically and online were Assistant 23 Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General 24 Chad Standifer representing PDC Staff, and Tabitha Townsend, PDC Compliance Coordinator. 25

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Notice was provided to the Respondent and he appeared on his own behalf. The proceeding was

open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-25 et. seq. and recorded.

The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

- Case memorandum dated October 6, 2021, prepared by Tabitha Townsend, PDC Compliance Coordinator;
- 2. Brief Enforcement Hearing Notice served July 20, 2021;
- 3. F-1 covering the prior twelve months filed September 2, 2021;
- 4. C-1 Report filed September 2, 2021;
- 5. Initial Order Imposing Fine, served September 15, 2021;
- 6. Respondent's request for Review, dated September 22, 2021.

## I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involved Respondent's request that the Commission review an Initial Order entered on September 13, 2021, resulting from an Initial Hearing on August 12, 2021, regarding Melvin Taylor, a candidate for City Council Member for the City of Aberdeen during election year 2021. The Presiding Officer at the Brief Adjudicative Proceeding found the Respondent in violation of RCW 42.17A.205 for failure to timely file a Candidate Registration (C-1 Report) and RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) with the Public Disclosure Commission no later than June 4, 2021. At the August 12, 2021, hearing, the Presiding Officer imposed a \$500 penalty, with \$200 suspended, which the Respondent now requests the Commission review. The Respondent has no prior violations with the PDC.

1. In May and June of 2021, PDC staff sent email reminders to all candidates for election year 2021 regarding their missing C-1 Report, F-1 Report, or both.

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	2. On June 17, 2021, PDC staff emailed the Respondent a Warning Notice	
2		regarding the C-1 and F-1 Reports. The hearing notice was sent to the
3		Respondent's email address of record.
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5	3.	On July 21, 2021, PDC staff emailed the Respondent a hearing notice for a
6		Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing) to be held on
7		August 12, 2021. The hearing notice was sent to the Respondent's email
8		address of record.
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10	4.	At the Brief Enforcement Hearing held on August 12, 2021, the Respondent
11		was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.205 and .700 for failure to timely file
12		the missing C-1 and F-1 Reports no later than June 4, 2021 and was assessed a
13		\$500 penalty consistent with WAC 390-37-143, the Brief Enforcement Hearing
14		penalty schedule adopted by the Commission. The Presiding Officer suspended
15		\$200 of the \$500 penalty conditioned upon the Respondent filing the missing C-
16		1 and F-1 reports and paying the non-suspended \$300 penalty within 30 days of
17		the Initial Order being entered.
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19	5.	On September 15, 2021, the Respondent was served with the Initial Order
20	memorializing the Commission's ruling to the Respondent's email address of	
21		record.
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23	6.	The Respondent filed the F-1 Report and the C-1 report on September 2, 2021.
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25	7.	On September 22, 2021, the Respondent submitted written materials appealing
26		the September 13, 2021, order based on financial hardship. Respondent
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testified he had lost his job, contracted COVID-19, and suffered from anxiety and depression.			
II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW			
1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter			
42.17A. RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05			
RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.			
2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.205, a candidate for election year 2021 was required			
file a C-1 Report within two weeks of candidacy or no later than June 4, 2021.			
3. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, a candidate for election year 2021 was required			
to file an F-1 Report, disclosing financial information for the prior twelve			
months, within two weeks of candidacy or no later than June 4, 2021.			
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III. ORDER  This Order on Povious will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating			
This Order on Review will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating			
and aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Initial Hearing			
Order assessing a \$500 civil penalty, with \$200 suspended, is AFFIRMED.
