He asked me if I lived in Canterwood, to which I replied yes. Then he asked me not to give him "that piece of junk" and I assured him that I would not do so. I saw him a 1/2 hour later and he asked me if I and permission to give some of my neighbors my vcnadidate recommendations and I said yes.

I did not give either person who filed the complaint, one of my handouts, so I do not know how they obtained them. They must have removed them from under the intended recepients mailbox.

I was distributing my personal recommendations about who to support for local office, to a small group of my neighbors and friends. . There is nothing on the back page of my paper. I believe that I am free to communicate my thoughts with several dozen of my neighbors, and friends, due to the 1st Amendment of our Constitution., without interference from angry strangers, who disagree with my point of view.

I made up these materials; distributing them was my idea. This handout is not part of any political campaign, or for a particular candidate, nor any political party, nor is it sponsored by any political organization.. Several of these candidates are running for non partisan office. I paid for the paper and printing and the design, myself. There was a small printing cost for the information that I handed out, approximately \$25.

I was given permission to distribute my recommendations, to my like minded neighbors, by the Canterwood security officer on duty that day. . I do not believe that I have violated any PDC laws. or political regulations. Do I need to put my name on the bottom of my handout? Please let me know.
