-- It is my belief that this mailer has not or will not be filed in campaign disclosures for these candidates. Based on the fact that they are mini-filers, this mailer, in combination with and other campaign expenditures, will very likely be exceed campaign expenditure limits.

-- If, on the on the other hand, this is an independent expenditure, the contributors are not properly disclosed and, from my research, have not filed the appropriate C6 in a timely manner.

What impact does the alleged violation(s) have on the public?

It is my belief that the these candidates have violated both their campaign contribution limits and failed to report donations and expenditures that would demonstrate this. In a small town race, overspending has a deleterious effect on the elections, giving some candidates a pronounced higher degree of visibility, while their opponents are still playing by the rules.


