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14	I. INTRODUCTION	
15	This matter was heard in-person and remotely by the Washington State Public Disclosure	
16	Commission (Commission) on May 26, 2022, by telephonic and online streaming access. The	
17	hearing was held pursuant to Chapter 34.05 RCW, Chapter 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37	
18	WAC.	
19	Commissioners present were Nancy Isserlis, Acting Commission Chair (presiding), and	
20	Commissioners William Downing, Allen Hayward, and Jocelyn Cooney. Also present were	
21	Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader represent	ting the Commission, Assistant Attorney
22	General Chad Standifer representing Commission sta	ff, and Tabatha Blacksmith, Compliance
23	Coordinator, on behalf of PDC Staff. Respondent Gera	ald (Jerry) Lord did not appear on his own
24	behalf. The proceeding was open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-28 et	
25	seq. and recorded.	
26	The hearing concerned allegations that Gerald	(Jerry) Lord violated RCW 42.17A.700

1	by failing to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 report) disclosing personal	
2	financial information for calendar years 2020 and 2021 that were due no later than April 15,	
3	2021 and April 15, 2022, respectively.	
4	The Commissioners had before them the following materials:	
5	o Case Memorandum for PDC Case No. 108247 prepared by Tabatha Blacksmith and	
6	dated May 18, 2022;	
7	o Exhibit 1: Warning notice of the late filed F-1 reports, served April 18, 2022;	
8	 Exhibit 2: Enforcement Hearing Notice, served May 12, 2022; 	
9	o Exhibit 3: Initial Order, entered January 11, 2021, PDC Case 80264.	
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11	II. FINDINGS OF FACT	
12	1. Gerald (Jerry) Lord is a City Council Member for the City of Chehalis. His term	
13	began on January 1, 2020, and ends on December 31, 2023.	
14	2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an elected or appointed official who held office in	
15	2020 and 2021 is required to file Personal financial Affairs Statements (F-1 reports) disclosing	
16	financial activities for calendar year 2020 and 2021 no later than April 15, 2021 and April 15,	
17	2022, respectively. The Respondent failed to timely file both reports.	
18	3. From March 3, 2021, through April 28, 2021, PDC staff emailed reminders to	
19	elected and appointed officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2020.	
20	4. From March 10, 2022 through April 5, 2022, PDC staff emailed reminders to	
21	elected and appointed officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2021.	
22	5. On April 18, 2022, PDC staff sent the Respondent a warning notice, by email and	
23	address of record, regarding the missing F-1 reports for calendar years 2020 and 2021. The	
24	email was sent to Respondent's official email address on file with the PDC.	
25	6. On May 12, 2022, PDC staff served the Respondent, by email and address of	

record, with a hearing notice for a May 26, 2022, Adjudicative Proceeding (Enforcement

1	Hearing) before the full Public Disclosure Commission concerning Respondent's failure to file	
2	the F-1 reports. The email was sent to the Respondent's personal email address.	
3	7. On May 15, 2021, the Respondent filed the F-1 reports for calendar years 2020	
4	and 2021.	
5	8. Prior violation of RCW 42.17A.700:	
6	a) PDC Case No. 80264:	
7 8	 The Respondent failed to timely file an F-1 report for calendar year 2019, which was due no later than April 15, 2020. 	
9	 At a December 17, 2020, Brief Adjudicative Proceeding the Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 and assessed a \$250 penalty for failing to file an F-1 report for calendar year 2019. 	
11	• To date the Respondent has not filed the missing F-1 report for calendar year 2019 and has not paid the \$250 civil penalty which has been sent to collections.	
12 13	III. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW	
14	1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 42.17A	
15	RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative	
16	Procedure Act: and Title 390 WAC.	
17	2. Based on the above Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and hearing testimony, the	
18	Commission concludes:	
19	a. Gerald (Jerry) Lord violated RCW 42.17A.700 by failing to timely file F-1	
20	financial reports for the years 2020 and 2021.	
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22	IV. ORDER	
23	Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Commission orders that:	
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25	1. Respondent Gerald (Jerry) Lord is assessed a total civil penalty of \$750 which	
26	shall be paid within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.	
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2	2. The missing F-1 report for calendar year 2019 shall be filed within 30 days of the	
3	date of this Order. If the Respondent fails to comply with the filing of the F-1	
4	report or fails to make timely payment of the civil penalties, PDC staff may send	
5	the amounts due for collection without further action by the Commission.
