Respondent Jean 16 Dillenburg was provided notice on August 11, 2022, of the hearing date. The hearing was held 17 in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC. 18 Commissioners present both telephonically and online were Fred Jarrett, Commission 19 Chair (presiding); Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners William 20 Downing, Allen Hayward, and Jocelyn Cooney. Also present both telephonically and online 21 were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant 22 Attorney General Chad Standifer representing PDC Staff, and Jordan Campbell, PDC 23 Compliance Coordinator. Notice was provided to the Respondent and she did not appear on her 24 own behalf. The proceeding was open to the public as limited by Governor's Proclamation 20-25 25 et seq. and recorded.

## I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The matter involves Respondent Jean Dillenburg, an elected Hospital Commissioner for Grant County Hospital District 4. Respondent is alleged to have violated RCW 42.17A.700 for failure to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) with the Public Disclosure Commission no later than April 15, 2022, disclosing financial information for the calendar year 2021. The Respondent has paid the penalty balance of \$250 from one prior violation but has not filed the missing F-1 report for calendar year 2020.

- Between March 10<sup>th</sup> and April 5<sup>th</sup> of 2022, PDC staff sent email reminders to all elected and appointed officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2021.
- 2. On April 18, 2022, PDC staff emailed the Respondent a warning notice regarding the missing 2020 and 2021 F-1 reports.
- 3. On August 11, 2022, PDC Staff served the Respondent by email and mail with a hearing notice for an August 25, 2022, Enforcement Hearing, along with instructions on how to participate in the hearing remotely, before the full Public

2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700, an elected or appointed official who held office in 2021 was required to file an F-1 Report, disclosing financial information for calendar year 2021 no later than April 15, 2022.

## III. ORDER

This Order will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating and aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Commission assesses a civil penalty of \$1,000 for the late filed F-1 Report with \$500 suspended on the following conditions:

- a. The \$500 non-suspended portion of the civil penalty due for failure to timely file the F-1 report for calendar year 2021 in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 is paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
  - b. The missing F-1 reports for calendar years 2020, and 2021, are filed within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
  - c. The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC reporting requirements and is not found to have committed any further violations of Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date of this Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be assessed based solely upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified by the Commission as appropriate to address by a technical correction.
