The 16 hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 17 WAC. 18 Commissioners present in-person were Fred Jarrett, Commission Chair (presiding); 19 Nancy Isserlis, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners William Downing and Allen 20 Haywood. Also present both in-person and online were Assistant Attorney General John S. 21 Meader representing the Commission, Assistant Attorneys General Chad Standifer and Susie 22 Giles-Klein representing PDC Staff, and Erick Agina, PDC Compliance Officer. Notice was 23 provided to the Respondent and he did not appear on his own behalf. The proceeding was open 24 to the public and recorded. 25 The Commissioners had before them the following materials: 26

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

This matter involves allegations the Respondent violated RCW 42.17A.205 and RCW 42.17A.700(2) by failing to file the required Candidate Registration (C-1 Report) and Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) within two weeks of declaring his candidacy for public office in the 2023 election year, as required by law. The Respondent has two prior violations with the PDC.

1. On January 3, 2023, the Respondent attended a City of Kirkland Council meeting and announced his candidacy for public office during the public comment portion of the meeting, stating: "[m]y name is Alex Tsimerman and I right now candidate for King County Bellevue Council 2023" [sic].

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| 23 | | II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW | | | |
| 24 | 1. | The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter | | | |
| 25 | | 42.17A. RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 | | | |
| 26 | | RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC. | | | |
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- 2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.205, a candidate for an election year must file a Candidate Registration (C-1 Report) within two weeks of declaring his candidacy for public office.
- 3. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700(2) a candidate for an election year must file a Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) within two weeks of declaring his candidacy for public office.
- 4. RCW 42.17A.005(8) defines a candidate as any individual who seeks nomination for election or election to public office. An individual seeks nomination or election when the individual first: ...(b) Announces publicly or files for office...
- 5. The definition of "candidate" in RCW 42.17.005(8) is broad enough to encompass the Respondent's public declarations of his candidacy. There is also sufficient evidence to support the conclusion that the Respondent declared his candidacy for office and the Commission can infer the office referred to was King County Council Position 6 for election year 2023.

III. ORDER

This Order will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating and aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Respondent is assessed a civil penalty of \$5,000 with \$2,000 suspended on the following conditions:
