17	I. INTRODUC	CHON				
18	This matter was heard by the Washington Sta	te Public Disclosure Commission (PDC,				
19	Commission) on July 24, 2025, by in-person, teleph	onic, and online streaming access. The				
20	hearing was held pursuant to Chapter 34.05 RCW, Chapter 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37					
21	WAC.					
22	Commissioners present in-person were J. Robo	ert Leach, Commission Chair (presiding);				
23	Douglass North, Commission Vice-Chair; and Chair; a	mmissioners Nancy Isserlis and James				
24	Oswald. Also present online were Assistant Attorne	y General William Schwarz representing				
25	the Commission; and Assistant Attorney General Su	usie Giles-Klein representing PDC staff.				
26	Tanya Mercier, Compliance Officer for PDC Staff, app	peared in person and Shaun Scott appeared				

online for the Respondent. The proceeding was open to the public and recorded.

The hearing concerned allegations that the Respondent violated RCW 42.17A.235 and .240, and WAC 390-16-042, WAC 390-16-205, and WAC 390-16-043 by reporting incomplete or inaccurate information on pre-primary Cash Receipts, Monetary Contribution (C-3) and receipts and Expenditure Summary (C-4) reports and failing to timely file mandatory 21-day, 7-day, and post-primary C-4 reports; failing to timely file mandatory 21-day and 7-day pre-general reports; failing to timely and accurately report debt and receipt of contributions; and by failing to provide campaign books of account for inspection. It was further alleged that during election year 2024, the Committee violated RCW 42.17A.320 and WAC 390-18-010 by failing to include complete sponsor identification on political advertisements; failing to conform to formatting requirements; and using an assumed name for the sponsor identification. As to Mr. Scott personally, he is alleged to have violated RCW 42.17A.445 and WAC 390-16-238 by expending campaign funds for impermissible personal use.

18	II. STIPULATION	
19	The parties jointly submitted a signed Stipulation as to Facts and Violations,	
20	(Stipulation). Ms. Giles-Klein presented the Stipulation, reviewed the aggravating and	
21	mitigating factors, summarized the facts and asked the Commission to accept the Stipulation.	
22	Mr. Scott was available for questions and confirmed the information provided by Ms. Giles-	
23	Klein. The Respondent took responsibility and asked the Commission to accept the Stipulation.	
24	The Commission voted 4-0 to accept the Stipulation as submitted.

1. The Respondent, Shaun Scott created The Fighting 43rd campaign committee on March 14, 2024. The Committee was created to support Mr. Scott's campaign for State Representative of the 43rd Legislative District, Position 2. During election year 2024, the Committee received contributions totaling \$147,304.57 and spent \$141,958.47 in total. As of December 2024, the Committee had \$33,498.06 in outstanding debt. The Committee's first Treasurer was Jay Plancich, and on or about October 21, 2024, Jason Bennett became the Committee's Treasurer. During the 2024 General Election Mr. Scott was elected to the House of Representatives. Respondent has no prior violations with the PDC.

2. The facts of the Respondent's primary election reporting issues, general election reporting issues, failure to provide campaign books of accounts for inspection, issues related to sponsor identification on political advertising, and impermissible use of campaign funds are described on pages 2-9 of the Stipulation (Sections 2-27) and are incorporated by reference into this order.

IV. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 42.17A RCW, the state campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.

2. The Commission accepts the parties' agreed stipulation to violations of RCW 42.17A.235, RCW 42.17A.240, WAC 390-16-042, WAC 390-16-205, and WAC 390-16-043 by: (1) reporting incomplete or inaccurate information on Cash Receipts, Monetary Contribution (C-3), and Receipts & Expenditure Summary (C-4) reports and failing to timely file mandatory 21-day, 7-day, and post-primary C-4 reports; (2) failing to timely file mandatory 21-day and 7-day

1	pre-general reports; (3) failing to timely and accurately report debt and receipt of contributions;
2	and (4) failing to provide campaign books of account inspection.
3	The Commission further accepts the parties' stipulation to violations of RCW 42.17A.320 and
4	WAC 390-18-010 by: (1) failing to include complete sponsor identification on political
5	advertisements; (2) failing to conform to formatting requirements; and (3) using an assumed
6	name for the sponsor identification on political advertisements. Additionally, the Commission
7	accepts Mr. Scott's stipulation to violation of RCW 42.17A.445 and WAC 390-16-238 by
8	expending campaign funds for impermissible personal use.
9	
10	3. The mitigating and aggravating factors in the Stipulation on pages 9-11 (Sections 28-
11	34) are incorporated by reference into this order. In addition, the Commission acknowledges
12	the mitigating factor of the difficulty of a candidate running his own campaign and

simultaneously managing financial reporting after his Treasurer leaves unexpectedly.

Based upon the stipulated Findings of Fact and the Commission's Conclusions of Law, the Commission accepts the agreed Stipulation of the parties as to Facts and Violations. After review of the mitigating and aggravating factors and consideration of the arguments and exhibits presented at hearing, the Commission assesses an aggregate civil penalty on Respondent The Fighting 43rd of \$10,000 with \$5,000 suspended on the conditions in Section V(1) of this order. In addition, the Commission assesses a civil penalty on Respondent Shaun Scott of \$1,000 with \$500 suspended on the conditions in Section V(2) of this order.

1. Respondent The Fighting 43rd Committee shall pay an aggregate civil penalty of \$10,000 for all violations, except those separately assessed in Section V(2) of this order, with \$5,000 suspended on the following conditions:

2		a.	The non-suspended portion of the penalty (\$5,000) is paid by the
3			Respondent within 90 days of the date of the Final Order.

5		b.	The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC reporting
6			requirements and is not found to have committed any further violations
7			of Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date
8			of this Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be assessed based
9			solely upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified
10			by the Commission as appropriate to address by a technical correction.

12		c.	If the Respondent fails to make timely payment of the non-suspended
13			portion of the penalty, the total civil penalty of \$10,000 shall
14			immediately become due and the matter may be sent to collection or
15			brought to Superior Court as allowed by law without further action by
16			the Commission.

5	solely upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified			
6	by the Commission as appropriate to address by a technical correction.

8	d. If the Respondent fails to make timely payment of the non-suspended			
9	portion of the penalty, the total civil penalty of \$1,000 shall immediately			
10	become due and the matter may be sent to collection or brought to			
11	Superior Court as allowed by law without further action by the			
12	Commission.
