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## Public Disclosure Commission Statement of Understanding Maggie Yates PDC Case 160532

I, Maggie Yates, hereby acknowledge that, during election year 2022, while a candidate running for election to the position of County Commissioner for Spokane County, I violated RCW 42.17A.235 and .240 by failing to timely and accurately file Summary Full Campaign Contributions and Expenditures reports (C-4 reports).

The facts are as follows:

- o I was a candidate for Spokane County Commissioner during the 2022 election and my name appeared on the November 8, 2022, General Election.
- As a candidate registered under the "Full Reporting" option and appearing on the
   2022 General Election, I was required to file the Post Election C-4 report covering
   November 1 30, 2022, by no later than December 12, 2022.
- I submitted the Post Election C-4 report 610 days late on August 13, 2024, disclosing \$47,658.24 in total expenditures.

I would like to avoid the time and expense of a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing). Therefore, in lieu of a hearing, I acknowledge that I violated Washington State law as described above and agree to enter into this *Statement of Understanding* (SOU) to resolve the above matter with the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC).

In accordance with the Penalty Schedule adopted by the Commission for Brief Enforcement Hearings set forth in WAC 390-37-143, I agree to pay a \$150 penalty for acknowledged violations of RCW 42.17A.235 and .240 for failing to timely and accurately file C-4 reports during election year 2022.

I understand that, by signing this SOU, I acknowledge the violation of Chapter 42.17A RCW and Title 390 WAC set forth above and waive my right to a hearing in this matter. I further understand that signing this SOU and returning it to the PDC with a payment for the \$150 civil penalty will resolve the issue of my failure to timely and accurately file C-4 reports for election year 2022 indicated above.

## **Electronic Payment Option**

Please be aware, processing fees may apply. To start the process for making an online payment, do the following:

Email an electronic copy of the signed SOU to the Compliance Officer assigned to your case.

- A photo or scan of the signed SOU is acceptable. Do make sure that all parts of the SOU are within focus and readable.
- To email the signed SOU to your Compliance Officer, reply directly to the last email you had with the Compliance Officer and attach the document.
- The Compliance Officer must receive the signed SOU no later than **DATE**.
  - o A signed SOU is required for the terms of the agreement to be fulfilled.
  - o If we do not receive the SOU, your case will be scheduled for the next available Brief Adjudicative Proceeding (BAP). If this occurs, the Commission's Presiding Officer will hear the case.
  - o If you send the SOU and payment electronically, you DO NOT need to mail a hard copy of the SOU to your Compliance Officer

Once the SOU is received, PDC staff will email a payment link and further instructions about how to make a payment.

• You must send the payment, via the link, no later than **DATE**.
