HEARING NOTICE FOR ENFORCEMENT MATTER (AMENDED)

Authority: RCW 42.17A and WAC 390

In accordance with RCW 42.17A.110 and RCW 42.17A.755, the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) will conduct a hearing concerning staff's allegations that Green Jobs PAC violated RCW 42.17A.235, RCW 42.17A.240, WAC 390-16-205, and WAC 390-16-037 by: (1) failing to timely file the 7-day Pre-General Election C-4 report covering October 15–28, 2024; (2) failing to disclose detailed information regarding subvendors used for campaign expenditures; and (3) failing failed to identify the specific ballot measure opposed by each expenditure on its C-4 reports..

The Commission may consider accepting a Stipulation if presented by the parties. See [WAC 390-37-090](#). The Commission has the authority to assess a penalty of up to \$10,000 per violation in accordance with [WAC 390-37-182](#).

You may submit written material no later than 4:00 p.m. on Monday, June 23, 2025 for review by Commission members. You may do so by writing to the Chair, Public Disclosure Commission, P.O. Box 40908, Olympia, WA 98504-0908, or by email at pdcc@pdcc.wa.gov. If you submit such evidence by postal mail, please also submit it by email.

The Public Disclosure Commission recommends that respondents personally appear whenever possible. PDC staff will be represented by an Assistant Attorney General for the presentation of this matter to the Commission.

Complainant Notice Rights:

In accordance with [WAC 390-37-060\(5\)](#), the complainant is being provided notice in advance of the enforcement hearing. In accordance with [WAC 390-37-030](#), the complainant does not have special standing to intervene in the hearing. The presiding officer has the discretion to allow comments by a person other than the respondent during their consideration of the complaint. Any person who wishes to comment should notify staff at least three business days before the proceeding.

[WAC 390-37-030](#) also allows the complainant or any other person to submit documentary evidence and/or written factual or legal statements to the staff at any time up to and including the fifth calendar day before the date of any enforcement hearing or proceeding. Such information should be sent electronically to pdcc@pdc.wa.gov.
