<p>Conner Edwards reported via the portal (Mon, 4 Nov 2024 at 12:53 PM)</p> <p>Description of Complaint</p> <p>See attached complaint.</p> <p>Notice to Respondent</p> <p>I apologize to you for any inconvenience caused by this complaint. The chance that you will actually be fined for the violations identified above is extremely small because the agency is averse to doing the work necessary to bring cases to hearings. Most likely this case – and any future cases against you – will simply be dismissed by staff with a so-called "warning letter".</p> <p>This complaint is one of hundreds that I have filed to highlight and ultimately fix the significant shortcomings associated with the agency responsible for administering our state's campaign finance laws.</p> <p>What are these shortcomings?</p> <p>Overcomplicated and outdated requirements that are difficult to understand and comply with. Failure to properly educate the regulated community about the tasks they must perform to remain in compliance with applicable requirements and avoid complaints. Failure of the agency to send regular reminders to filers about pending deadlines. A failure to proactively enforce applicable requirements which enables the complaint system to become weaponized. Non-intuitive, non-user friendly, and buggy reporting software. Failure to meaningfully enforce core requirements. Failure to follow the best operating practices of other neighboring campaign finance agencies. An agency leadership structure that largely disregards stakeholder input and is slow to identify and resolve major agency deficiencies.</p> <p>I believe that the best way to motivate the agency to address these problems is by filing a large number of complaints so that the agency's problems become impossible to ignore.</p> <p>Slowly (too slowly) this strategy is starting to yield concrete and beneficial changes. Grassroots Lobbying

Definition

Grassroots lobbying is defined as a program *addressed to the general public, a substantial portion of which is intended, designed or calculated primarily to influence state legislation.* [RCW 42.17A.640](#)

Typical grassroots lobbying expenditures include:

- newspaper advertisements to support proposed legislation,
- hiring a person to organize public meetings in order to influence action on issues being considered by the legislature,
- creating or maintaining websites, purchasing e-mail lists, or hiring someone to conduct other online activities, and
- hiring signature gatherers to circulate petitions for an initiative to the Legislature.

The Washington State Legislature recently updated legislation regarding grassroots lobbying through [House Bill 1317](#). Click [here](#) to see the updated sections of RCW 42.17A.640.

In December 2023, the Public Disclosure Commission approved new rules for grassroots lobbying under [WAC 390-20-125](#).

Disclosure

Registration Requirement

Any person or entity making grassroots lobbying expenditures not reported by a registered lobbyist, a candidate, or a political committee **exceeding \$1,500** in the aggregate in a one-month period or **exceeding \$3,000** in the aggregate in any three-month period must register as a sponsor of a grassroots lobbying campaign. Exception: If an organization sends a notice about pending legislation to its members, or a corporation sends a similar message to its stockholders, the expenses related to these activities are not reportable as grassroots lobbying.

A campaign must register and file its initial grassroots lobbying report ([PDC Form L-6](#)) within 24 hours of the initial presentation to the public when that occurs during the period beginning 30 days before the regular legislative session through the end of that session, or during any special session.

Any other time of the year, grassroots lobbying campaigns must register with the PDC within five days of the initial presentation to the public. Thereafter, sponsors file monthly reports on the 10th of the month covering the preceding calendar month. When the campaign is finished and the last report is being filed, check the final report box.

Please note that any grassroots lobbying campaigns that also meet the definition of [electioneering communication](#) will need to also report via a [C-6](#). ([WAC 390-16-063](#))

Sponsor Identification

Any advertising or mass communication produced as part of the campaign must include the following disclosures.

- All written communications need to include the sponsor's name and address and all radio and television communications need to include the sponsor's name.
- If the sponsor is a political committee controlled directly or indirectly by an individual, corporation, union, association or other entity, the communications need to include the name of that individual or entity.
- If a communication or advertisement costs \$1,000 or more, it needs to include a list of the campaign's top five contributors as described in RCW 42.17A.350. If one of those contributors is a political action committee, follow disclosure requirements under RCW 42.17A.350(2).
- RCW 42.17A.640 describes the requirements for sponsor identification on written communications, television and radio broadcasts.

Alternative Disclosure Methods

Lobbyists can relieve their employers from the responsibility of filing an L-6 report by including grassroots lobbying expenditures on their L-2 reports, *provided* that the grassroots campaign is financed out of the employer's existing funds. If the employer conducts a special fundraising effort or accepts funds from other sources to finance the grassroots lobbying, L-6 reporting is required (and expenses would not be included on the L-2).

Candidates and political committees who sponsor grassroots lobbying campaigns do not need to file L-6 reports, whether they use existing funds or receive funds from outside sources. Instead, the contribution and expenditure activity, including that related to grassroots lobbying, is fully reported on their campaign disclosure reports (the "C" series).

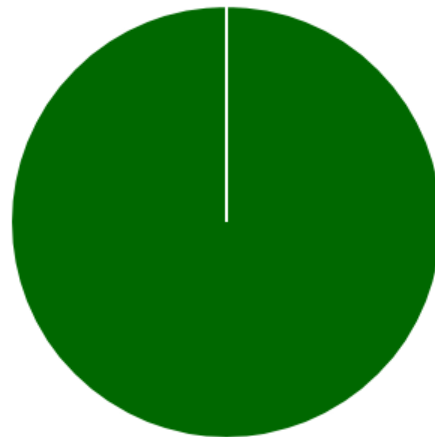

Background

Washington State's Grassroots Disclosure Law

One of the primary purposes of the public disclosure law is to provide citizens of this state, and especially voters, with the means for becoming informed about the financing of grassroots lobbying campaigns. The public disclosure law was enacted through voter approval of Initiative 276 in 1972. A subsequent amendment to that law relating to grassroots lobbying was passed in 2023 when Governor Inslee signed HB 1317 into law.

Any person or entity making grassroots lobbying expenditures not reported by a registered lobbyist, a candidate, or a political committee exceeding \$1,500 in the aggregate in a one-month period or exceeding \$3,000 in the aggregate in any three-month period must register as a sponsor of a grassroots lobbying campaign.¹

A campaign must register and file its initial grassroots lobbying report (PDC Form L-6) within 24 hours of the initial presentation to the public when that occurs during the period beginning 30 days before the regular legislative session through the end of that session, or during any special session. Any other time of the year, grassroots lobbying campaigns must register with the PDC within five days of the initial presentation to the public. Thereafter, sponsors file monthly reports on the 10th of the month covering the preceding calendar month.

Violation

The following grassroots lobbying reports appear to have been filed significantly late. The amount of activity reported on these forms consists of hundreds of thousands of dollars that were disclosed well after the applicable deadline. See table below.

Notice to Respondent

I apologize to you for any inconvenience caused by this complaint. The chance that you will actually be fined for the violations identified above is extremely small because the agency is averse to doing the work necessary to bring cases to hearings. Most likely this case – and any future cases against you – will simply be dismissed by staff with a so-called "warning letter".

This complaint is one of hundreds that I have filed to highlight and ultimately fix the significant shortcomings associated with the agency responsible for administering our state's campaign finance laws.

What are these shortcomings?

Overcomplicated and outdated requirements that are difficult to understand and comply with. Failure to properly educate the regulated community about the tasks they must perform to remain in compliance with applicable requirements and avoid complaints. Failure of the agency to send regular reminders to filers about pending deadlines. A failure to proactively enforce applicable requirements which enables the complaint system to become weaponized. Non-intuitive, non-user friendly, and buggy reporting software. Failure to meaningfully enforce core requirements. Failure to follow the best operating practices of other neighboring campaign finance agencies. An agency leadership structure that largely disregards stakeholder input and is slow to identify and resolve major agency deficiencies.

I believe that the best way to motivate the agency to address these problems is by filing a large number of complaints so that the agency's problems become impossible to ignore.
