Though the law doesn't state it explicitly, the assumption is that this content must be legible. In the ads that appeared December 31, 2025 - February 2, 2025, the top 5 donors are so blurred that they are almost illegible. We request that this text in any future ads be displayed clearly.

The public is unable to read clearly the top 5 donor information on the digital ad
