People must also attend a fundraiser event to win in addition to the posting. Giving away prizes for social media likes can be seen as an attempt to leverage or abuse the prestige of judicial office to promote personal interests, including a campaign, which is generally prohibited under Washington's Code of Judicial Conduct. It can also be seen as a violation of fund raising requirements under RCW 42.17A.230.

What impact does the alleged violation(s) have on the public?

Giving items for social media likes can be seen as an attempt to leverage or abuse the prestige of judicial office to promote personal interests, including a campaign, which is generally prohibited under Washington's Code of Judicial Conduct. it also creates a public distrust when any candidates violates the rules in place for those running for office.
